HELPING THOSE IN NEED

Council 8086 is helping to end hunger in our communities. Many people in our area are struggling through hardship and unable to provide food to their families.

Working with Our Lady of Hope and the Orlando Diocese, our Council sponsors the monthly Drive-through Food Drop. On Nov 22, our Knights, working side-by-side with volunteers from our parish and JROTC cadets from Mainland High School, provided 249 local families with two weeks worth of groceries. The families received fresh meat, fruit and vegetables, along with other staples.

Additionally, our Council donated \$500 to the OLOH Food Pantry. With food costs rising, more families are in need, especially at this time of year. The money will supplement food donations made by our church community, allowing the Food Pantry to purchase the type of food items that are most needed.






KNIGHT OF THE MONTH: SK Ron Holland



As we reflect on the season of Thanksgiving, we are filled with immense gratitude — not only for the incredible generosity you've shown, but also for the way God continues to work in the lives of the families we serve. Just as Moses was chosen to lead a nation, Sophia realized that God had a plan for her and her child — a plan full of hope and promise.

Through the prayers and encouragement of our team, and the community of believers surrounding her, Sophia chose to embrace her role as a mother, and in the process, she came to know Jesus Christ as her Savior. The day she gave her life to Christ was a day of new birth, not just for her child, but for her own heart. Just like the Israelites, who were delivered from bondage, Sophia experienced a kind of freedom she had never known before — a freedom in Christ, full of grace, peace, and purpose.

It is in stories like Sophia's that we see the deep power of adoption — both spiritual and physical. Through the love of Christ and the generosity of those like you, we are able to offer families a safe place to find belonging and the hope of a better future. Your support allows us to come alongside families, share the gospel, and walk with them as they make life-changing decisions, step by step, leading them toward Christ and His everlasting love.

This Thanksgiving, we are so grateful for you. Your faithful prayers, giving, and volunteering enables us to continue this important work. Together, we are helping to build families that will not only be disciples of Christ, but also disciple others for generations to come.
