NIGHT OF THE MONTH: SK MARK PROVENZANO

SK Mark Provenzano is being honored this month for his tireless work as a Good Samaritan and advocate for the homeless, notably during the harsh January winter temperatures. For the past 15 months, Mark has been helping the homeless in our area by buying and distributing blankets, clothing, coats and food; taking their dirty clothes to the laundromat and cleaning them; and money to those in need, and by securing donations for this cause.



Mark, who has been a member of OLOH parish with his wife Suzanne and family for the past eight years, also volunteers in our Council with the Tootsie Roll Drive, Loaves and Fishes, Grocery Distribution, Casino Night and the Food Pantry. But, his passion is to help the homeless.

His reasons are personal. The Connecticut native was homeless himself during a brutal winter when he was 17 years old. So he can relate to how those in need feel. He feels the homeless are forgotten and do not have the resources to help better their lives.

Mark should be commended for his outstanding efforts in saving lives this winter and for making a difference in the lives of many who need a hand up. Our Council is responding to Mark's advocacy by creating a Helping the Homeless Program to assist his efforts with resources and manpower. Please see Page 7.



FAMILY OF THE MONTH: GREG & LIZ LILLY

The Lilly Family has been active members of Our Lady of Hope for three generations. Our February Family of the Month Greg and Liz Family were married in 1989. They followed in Greg's parent's footsteps, providing a faithful upbringing to their two children in our parish.



When Greg decided to become a Knight in Council 13 years ago, he and his son Aaron went through their Exemplification together. They also advanced up to Third Degree together. Aaron, his wife Julie, and 17-year-old son Noah, are continuing the family involvement in our parish. Aaron serves in the liturgical orchestra at the 9 am mass, playing various instruments.

Their daughter Shaina, a former theology teacher at Fr Lopez High School, currently attends Our Lady of Lourdes Church in Melbourne with her husband and three children, where she is the Youth Director, and is involved in Faith Formation, the OLOL School and the Tecum Ministry for young adults.

The Lillys consider the Church to be an extension of their home and fellow parishioners as part of their family. "We tried to raise our children with that in mind so that they always consider Church...no matter where it is in the Catholic community, a second home they can always come to," said Greg.

Greg and Liz are both actively involved in many ministries here at OLOH. Greg currently serves on the AV (Audio Visual) team, the Cursillo Ministry, Pre-Cana Marriage Preparation Ministry, and the FOCCUS Marriage Preparation Ministry. He formerly served as as Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion, Cursillo Secretariat for the Diocese of Orlando, and Prison Ministry.

Liz currently heads the Lector Ministry, serves in the Pre-Cana Marriage Preparation Ministry, FOCCUS Marriage Preparation Ministry and AV team with Greg and is actively involved in the Cursillo movement. Additionally, she recently joined the parish staff on a part-time basis as the Communications Assistant.

Greg noted, "Our parish family is a blessing. When you're part of a close family like OLOH, the experiences and memories are too many to list."

FAITH IN ACTION HELPING THE HOMELESS

COUNCIL STEPPING UP TO HELP... SK PROVENZANO AID HOMELESS

When Florida saw some of the coldest temperatures in over 10 years, **Sir Knight Mark Provenzano**, who at one point in his life was homeless and is now a successful businessman, sprung into action to help save lives in the Daytona area.

With the help of Catholic Social Services in Orlando and local residents from New Smyrna Beach, **Mark** gathered up blankets, gloves, coats and meals ready to eat, and spent several days distributing the much-needed items to the freezing and hungry homeless. He also takes their well worn clothes, washes, dries and returns the items to the homeless so they will have clean clothes.

Mark is also a advocate for the homeless. He feels it's important for those who are fortunate to have a roof over their heads every night understand the plight of the homeless. He has taken time to speak with students at Fr. Lopez Catholic High School about his personal homeless experiences so they

have an understanding of how difficult life is for the people living on the streets in our communities.

Mark has been providing life essentials and making life a little better for the homeless in our area—doing all of this on his own dime for a long time. But, as the need continues to grow, he needs help. That's why Council 8086 is now partiallyfunding these important, life-saving efforts.

Council of 8086 is now establishing a group of Knights who, when Mark sounds the alarm for help, will muster and go out with him to help the homeless. This effort is headed by another Brother, who was also homeless at one point in his




