**As we pray for our nation, especially as we begin to look toward the 250th anniversary of our country's founding, we recognize both the blessings we have received and the work still before us.**

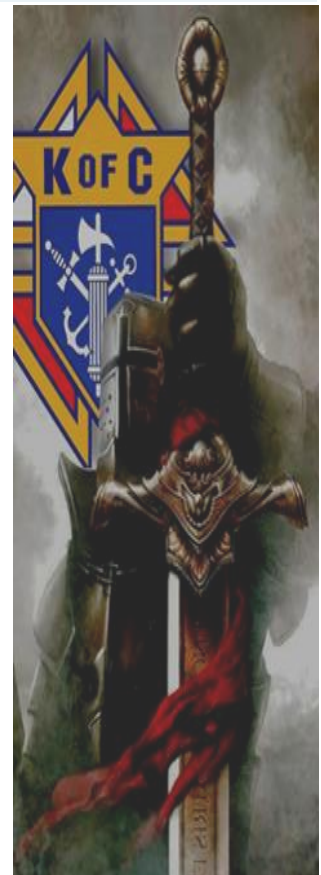

### Greetings from Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly and State Deputy Mike Gizewski.

What will be the big take-away from the recently completed Florida State Council Convention, held last weekend at Rosen Shingle Creek? Last year, we took back information for Wheelchair Weekends – a new concept for each of the District 20 councils. All three held weekends, with Our Lady of Hope 8086 and Epiphany 12569 each winning an award in their division. Sacred Heart's weekend was past the awards deadline, but they beat their goal by five times. Great job, everyone.



**This year's challenge is to hold a Retreat Sunday.** Joe McGivney – a relative of our founder – is working closely with Guest House, the world's first and most successful treatment and recovery center for Catholic clergy and religious. SK Joe credited his cousin for miraculously curing a serious ailment. He is using Guest House in an effort to follow in the footsteps of Blessed Father McGivney.

**We took first place in two of the four Faith in Action components – Faith and Community – and again ranked among the top three in the states. We were No. 1 in membership – no one else was close – and were presented the Century Award.**

**So, congratulations again to Council 8086 for an outstanding year.** One week from entering the fourth quarter, 8086 has recruited 114 new Knights, by far the best in the state. That's seven-star, 760-percent! Also, it's only six men shy of eight-star. Can we pull it off!

**After two months off for summer, Cor will resume on Tuesday, August 25, at 6:30 p.m. at Sacred Heart.** This will begin the new Cor chapter on the Eucharist. *All Catholic men are welcome.*

**Another Faith opportunity is the Florida Statewide Eucharistic Rosary Congress, Oct. 3-9.** Our councils have been challenged to make the Eucharistic Rosary Congress a parish priority, and to put together a small team to coordinate the local logistics that include seven days of perpetual adoration with a rosary at the top of every hour. *I know we have the team that can pull this off!*

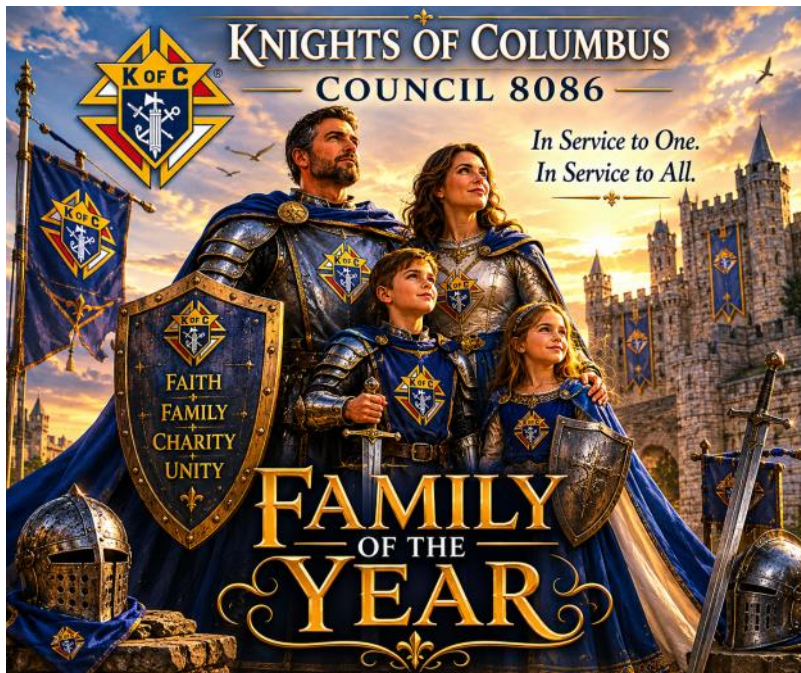

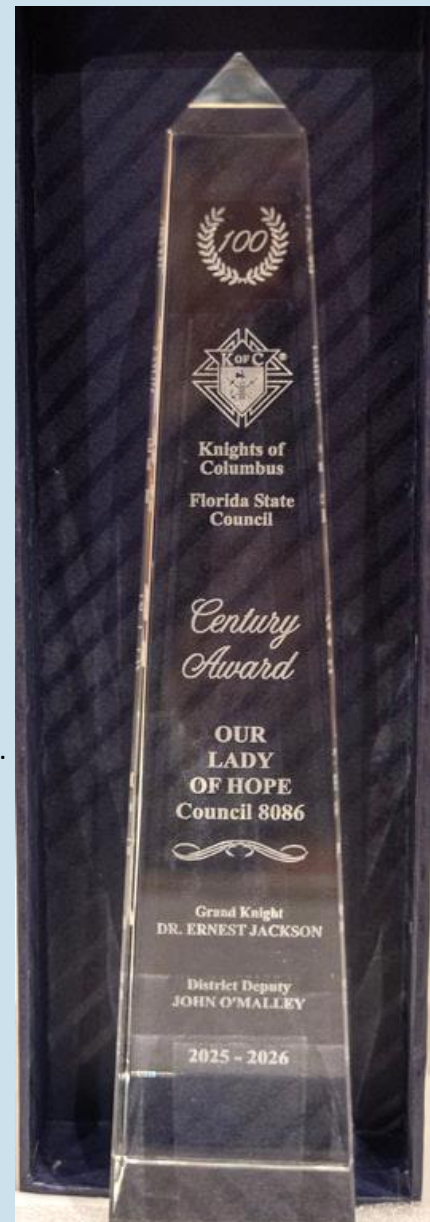
## 2025-2026 Florida Knights of Columbus

The Fourth Degree is a group of outstanding Knights, dedicated to promoting patriotism enlightened by their Catholic faith. These Knights, distinguished by exemplary deeds for God, for country, and the Order, are united by the Fourth Degree to support religious, civic, and charitable causes.

Fourth Degree members belong to local units called assemblies. Each assembly is involved in a wide range of public patriotic activities.

Each assembly maintains a Fourth Degree Color Corps and Honor Guard. Uniformed members wearing the Official Uniform, and swords participate in special civic and religious ceremonies. For this reason, the Fourth Degree is often called the visible arm of the Knights of Columbus.

ELIGIBILITY

To qualify for the Fourth Degree, one must:

1. Be over 18 years of age.
2. Be a member in good standing with your Council.
3. Be a practical Catholic.

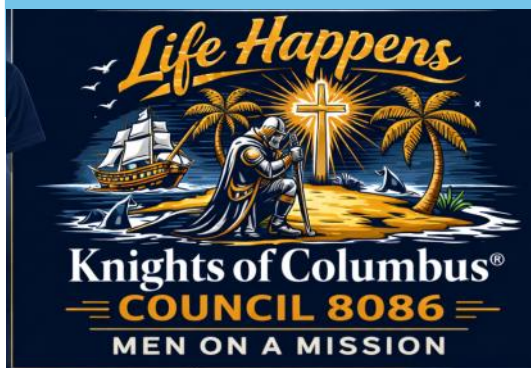
