For all the great things Mike and his wife Sally did over the years, they were selected as Family of the Year for Fraternal Year 2011/2012 which ran from July 1, 2011, to June 30, 2012. Not only did they win Council Family of the Year, but they also won the Florida State Family of the Year Award, WOW!

After Mike's passing his wife Sally gave his sword to Tony Jette, the Vice District Marshal for the Panhandle region of Florida. At the 4th Degree Assembly meeting, held on **April 3rd 2025**, Sir Knight Tony Jette, presented Mike's sword to the current Faithful Navigator, Sir Knight

Steve Malutich, in tribute to Mike and what he did over the years. Steve is the first recipient of the sword which will be passed on to future Faithful Navigators of the Joseph R Perrone Assembly 2789, to be worn during their tenure, to keep Mike's memory and everyone who knew Mike, may be reminded of the "Great Things" that Brother and Sir Knight Mike Murphy did for Council 7968 and Assembly 7968.


