Beginning January 1, 2026, a dividend increase took effect for eligible participating insurance policies, for the second year in a row. What does an increased dividend rate mean for you?

These dividends can be used in various ways, including:

- Receive the dividends in cash.
- Reduce billed premium.²
- Reduce an existing loan.

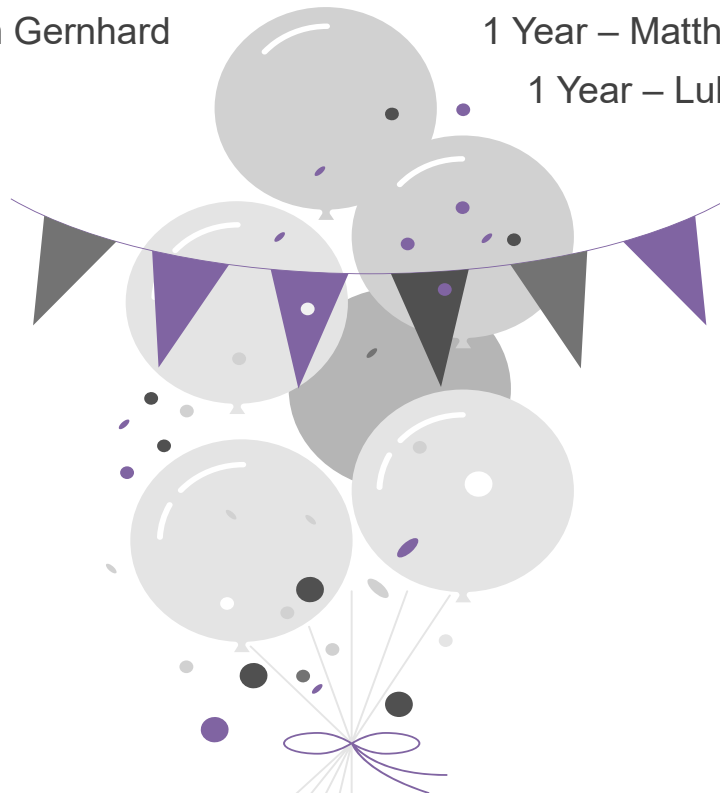

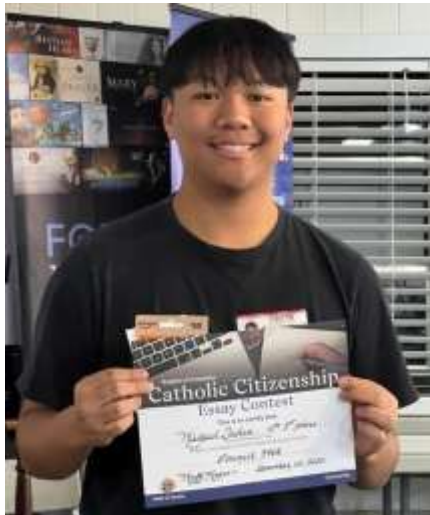
