On Preaching About Abortion

With the election upon us, this is a topic that needs to be addressed. These are a few excerpts from a homily given by Very Rev. John Lankeit on October 2, 2016 at St. Simon and Jude Cathedral in Phoenix, Arizona that are as true today as they were when they were first spoken. Because of the limitations of space, the entire homily could not be included.



Let's first acknowledge that there has never been a political party in the United States that is perfectly aligned with Catholic teaching on every issue. But that does not mean that we are therefore automatically free to vote for any party we want, because one party can be much further from Catholic principles on the most important issues than the other party. As a result of that, we are often faced with the task of discerning which party and which policies are most in-line with Catholic teaching and which ones are not.

So many issues are subject to the prudential judgment of Catholic voters - what does that mean? We hear that term thrown around: prudential judgment. It means that Catholics can legitimately disagree with each other - and even with their priest - on the best WAY to address issues (such as: racial injustice, education, the economy, immigration, and health care) and still remain in good standing with the Church. There are other issues, however, which touch on matters of intrinsic evil. (We hear that word as well. What does that mean?) These are actions that can never - at any time, under any circumstance - be committed, promoted, or even enabled by a faithful Catholic.

So, let's stop beating around the bush with regard to the presidential race. Do you know which candidate and party promotes abortion and even intends to expand its availability, both at home and abroad? Do you know that this candidate and party intend to make you and me pay for other people's abortion with our tax dollars, even though that has always been illegal in our country? Are you aware that this candidate and party - which until recently said that abortion should be "safe, legal, and rare" - no longer even bothers to say that it should be rare; but rather that it must be available anytime, anyplace, and up to the last moment that a fully-formed, full-term baby remains in the womb? Ignorance in this area is unacceptable, because ignorance in this area costs millions of babies their lives and jeopardizing the souls of many Catholic voters.

Every election season, when a priest addresses such topics from the pulpit, a certain portion of the population complains that he's preaching politics. "A priest has no business discussing politics in church." That's what some PEOPLE say. But what does God say to the priest whom he has designated to be a spiritual father for the people entrusted to his care? Here's what God said to the prophet Ezekiel:

"I have made you a watchman for the house of Israel. Whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you shall give them warning from me. If I say to the wicked, 'O wicked man, you shall surely die,' and you do not speak to warn the wicked to turn from his way — the wicked man shall die in his sin, but his blood I will require at your hand. But if you warn the wicked to turn from his way and he does not turn from his way, he shall die in his sin, but you will have saved your life." (Ezekiel 3:17-19)

Another of the devil's tactics is to encourage us to make excuses for our participation in very evil activities by appealing to the other good things we support, which we try to convince ourselves somehow cancel the grave evil we choose to participate in.

There are plenty of Catholics who quite rightly have criticized bishops and priests in recent years for not

having spoken out more forcefully against the sexual abuse of children by priests. Why, then, do many of these

same Catholics want to silence bishops and priests who speak out forcefully against KILLING innocent children? Why is opposing sexual abuse of children a matter of justice, but opposing the murder of children a matter of "preaching politics"?

A priest is not only protected by the First Amendment (at least, for now!); he is also bound by the Fifth Commandment: Thou shalt not kill. If a priest DOESN'T speak up for the most vulnerable in our society... and if the Catholic faithful don't ACTIVELY protect the most vulnerable in our society by refusing to enable their deliberate destruction with their vote, then such Catholics - the priests and the laity - are condoning the killing by their cowardice. And what did St. Paul write to Timothy in today's second reading about cowardice?

"God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control. So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord...; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God." (2 Tim 1:7-8)




Doctrine of the Trinity

One day, St. Augustine was walking on the beach, and he saw a little boy digging a

hole in the sand, and then running to the ocean, filling up his hands with seawater, running back to the hole and emptying the water into the hole. He watched the child go back and forth several times. Finally, he said to the boy, "What are you doing?" The boy said, "Trying to fill that hole with the ocean." And St. Augustine said, "You'll never fit the ocean in that hole." And the boy said, "Neither will you be able to fit the Trinity into your mind."

Scripture teaches that God exists as God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit - each of them a person, each of them God, and each of them comprising just one divine essence. The following words are the building blocks of the doctrine of the Trinity: "In the beginning, there was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God." [John 1:1] "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth." [John 1: 14] "Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit ... You have not lied to men but to God!" [Acts 5:3-4] It's all there – as plain as day. So, why have billions of people rejected the doctrine of the Trinity? Because they



simply can't wrap their mind around the concept. Humans are finite beings that lack the language skills to explain God because He is infinite. All attempts to wrap your mind around the doctrine result in heresies.

The first heretical teaching was modalism. A modalist is someone who believes God is one entity that changes modes as He sees fit. A proponent of this teaching was Sabellius. He was excommunicated in 220 A.D. by Pope Callixtus I. Interestingly, St. Augustine was accused of being a modalist. His emphasis on the oneness of God subjected him to this criticism. However, his assertion that he was not and did not want to be called a modalist made him rethink and express many of his ideas differently. Today, the Oneness Pentecostals adhere to modalism – 30 million people.

Partialism says that God is part Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. An analogy would be a shamrock. The three shamrock leaves represent Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It tried to compartmentalize each component. This prompted the church to convene the Council of Nicaea in 325 AD. Several heretical teachings were identified, and the Nicene Creed was created.

Tritheism is another heretical teaching. It says the Father, Son and Holy Spirit are three different people that work together. In other words, they are three separate Gods. Mormons are tritheists. There are 17 million Mormons.

Subordinationism is the final heretical teaching. It says the Son was created by the Father and submits to the Father thereby diminishing the Son's level of divinity compared to the Father. One failing is that they overlook the fact that Jesus was fully human – he got thirsty, ate food, was obedient to God and did not know the hour

of his coming. They did not understand that Jesus is the perfect example of a human. All humans are supposed to submit to the Father. Irenaeus, Hippolytus, and Tertullian were examples of subordinationists. This was declared heresy at the Council of Nicaea.

Judaism (16 million), Islam (1.9 billion), Jehovah's Witness (9 million), and Christian Science all deny the doctrine of the Trinity. Jesus warned us to beware of the leaven placed in the bread by the Pharisees and the Sadducees. We must be faithful to reject human opinion, concept, and tradition. At minimum, we must distinguish between it and the pure Word of the Lord. So, do not spend too much time trying to fit the doctrine of the Trinity into your own mind. Simply allow the Holy Spirit to guide you to the Way, the Truth, and the Life.



Knights of Columbus Supreme Council Update

<u>As Fishers of Men, College Knights Gather</u> <u>for Annual Conference</u>

More than 200 representatives from 70 college councils across North America met in New Haven, Connecticut, for prayer, leadership training and fraternity during the 59th Annual College Councils Conference from October 4 to October 6. This year's theme was, "Fishers of Men," and invited the Knights to discern how they are being called to evangelize through Christian discipleship on campus and beyond.

The Conference opened Friday and continued Saturday with breakout sessions; panel discussions about campus engagement, religious freedom and more; and presentations from Knights of Columbus leaders, including Deputy Supreme Knight

Arthur Peters. The Knights had an opportunity for adoration and confession in St. Mary's Church and a prayer of consecration to St. Joseph before a vigil Mass celebrated by Bishop Earl Fernandes of Columbus, Ohio.

"We need new missionaries, new apostles of God's love to transform our society," Bishop Fernandes told the college Knights in his homily. "You are soldiers of Christ in his army, ready to transform our world and our civilization, not by violence, but by the one real power in this world, and that is the power of love." The bishop expanded on the theme of missionary discipleship in his keynote address at the awards banquet that evening, urging students to become "spiritual entrepreneurs" to win souls for Christ. "The first characteristic of an entrepreneur is that he has a vision. ... Our vision is principally given to us by Jesus Christ in the New Testament to go and make disciples of all the nations," he said. "It says in the wisdom literature, 'without

vision, the people perish,' and our people are perishing right now because there's a lack of leadership, in particular from men in our society."

Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly, who introduced Bishop Fernandes as the keynote speaker, urged college

Knights to prioritize four things in the coming school year: faith, brotherhood, accountability, and action. "Your vocation now in life is a vocation of service. It's a vocation of service through your Council to others on campus," the supreme knight said. "You have so much to offer the other men on your campus; don't hesitate to invite them to join you and do it through friendship."

Acknowledging that many college Knights may face antagonism because of their faith, the Supreme Knight encouraged them to be Catholic gentlemen of integrity and honor. "Remember that you're not alone in these struggles," Supreme Knight Kelly said. "The Evil One wants you to think that you are alone, maybe that your Council is alone, but you're not alone. You have the Church, you have us. But most importantly, you have each other." Prince of Peace Council 8791 supports our College Knights.

WHEREAS, we are committed to "serving those who served" through the Veterans Affairs Voluntary Services program, with brother Knights donating nearly 100,000 hours of volunteer service at over 100 Department of Veterans Affairs medical centers in recent years; and

WHEREAS, we maintain 68 active military councils around the world that provide both material and spiritual support to answer the special needs of their local military and civilian communities.

NOW, THEREFORE, **BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Knights of Columbus reaffirms our unequivocal gratitude, support, and encouragement for the men and women of the armed forces who defend our liberties and freedoms; and



Florida Ballot Amendment 4

Amendment 4 seeks to erase pro-life protections by inserting language into the Florida Constitution prohibiting regulation of abortion. On October 3, Chancellor BK Ron Nowviskie attended a Voice for Life bus tour event at the South Daytona Christian Center to help rally support to defeat Amendment 4 on the November ballot. South Daytona was the third stop on a 12-city tour. The event included updates on the Vote No on 4 campaigns, strategies for the participation of churches and citizens, and networking with pro-life leaders and elected officials. Collectively, the Florida Conference of Catholic Bishops and the seven Florida dioceses have contributed well over \$1 million to defeat Amendment 4.

FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT EXPLAINED Why Floridians Should Vote NO on Amendment 4

Titled "Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion," Amendment 4 would enshrine **UNREGULATED ABORTION** in our state constitution, making Florida one of the **MOST PRO-ABORTION** states in the nation. The amendment language is **MISLEADING**, and its proposed outcomes are **DANGEROUS**.

WHAT IT SAYS

BALLOT SUMMARY

No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion

before viability

or when necessary to protect the patient's health,

as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.

This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

WHAT IT DOES

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Amendment 4 would jeopardize existing laws and prohibit new ones that voters on both sides of the abortion issue support, including health and safety laws that protect women.

ALLOWS SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS

Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb (Ch. 390.011(15)), generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.

CREATES A BROAD "HEALTH" LOOPHOLE

"Patient's health" is not defined in the amendment, allowing post-viability, extremely late-term abortions for treatable, temporary health concerns. Emotional health would justify an abortion when a child could survive outside the womb.

WEAKENS MEDICAL DOCTOR REQUIREMENT

"Healthcare providers" – not just physicians – could determine if an abortion is "necessary" to protect the mother's "health." Even some employees of abortion clinics, such as nurses and counselors, could approve late-term abortions.

ELIMINATES PARENTAL CONSENT

While preserving parental *notification* in our state constitution (Article X, Section 22), the amendment would invalidate the current law that requires parental *consent* for a minor to have an abortion (Ch. 390.01114(5)), making abortion the only medical decision for which parents have no say.


