Feast of the Guardian Angels

October 2nd is the Feast of the Guardian Angels. It is also a special Memorial Feast in the Liturgy of the Hours.

As adults we might not think about angels much, or at all for that matter. We may joke about our guardian angel working overtime if we have almost been involved in an accident, or if we were involved in an accident but no one was hurt. But I wonder how often we give serious thought about angels in general or guardian angels in particular.



Although Guardian Angels are not mentioned in the Bible by name, angels are mentioned in the New American Bible (Catholic Bible) 94 times.

In Acts, it says the high priest and all his supporters (that is, the party of the Sadducees), filled with jealousy, arrested the apostles and threw them into the public jail. During the night, however, an angel of the Lord opened the gates of the hail, led them forth, and said, "Go out now and take your place in the temple precincts and preach to the people all about this new life." (Acts 5:17–20) St. Bernard had this to say, "He has given His angels charge over you to guard you in all your ways. These words should fill you with respect, inspire devotion and instill confidence because of their protection. And so, the angels are here; they are at your side, they are with you, present on your behalf. They are here to protect you and to serve you. But even if it is God who has given them this charge, we must nonetheless be grateful to them for the great love with which they obey and come to help us in our great need."

With an angel looking out after Peter and the apostles, along with St. Bernard telling us angels exist, we should be grateful to them for their love and protection. With the mention of angels 94 times in the Bible, maybe we should take a little time to think about angels and what a gift angels are to us. Maybe we should say a prayer of thanksgiving to God for his gift of the angels sent to protect us and guide us on our life's journey.

I end with Saint Gertrude's Guardian Angel Prayer:

O most holy angel of God, appointed by God to be my guardian, I give you thanks for all the benefits which you have ever bestowed on me in body and in soul. I praise and glorify you that you condescended to assist me with such patient fidelity, and to defend me against all the assaults of my enemies. Blessed be the hour in which you were assigned me for my guardian, my defender and my patron. In acknowledgement and return for all your loving ministries to me, I offer you the infinitely precious and noble heart of Jesus, and firmly purpose to obey you henceforward, and most faithfully to serve my God. This month on September 15th, we celebrate the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows. In the year 1239, the Servite Order introduced the 7 Sorrows Chaplet of Mary. This chaplet was promoted by them during the Black Death in the 14th-century. Typically, people with

devotion to Mary, meditate on her sorrows since they are all based on Scripture and are an important part of salvation history. However, many do not know that St. Augustine said that they correspond to the 7 gifts of the Holy Spirit and to the Beatitudes.

1st Sorrow = Prophecy of Simeon

Gift = Fear of God

Beatitude = Blessed are the poor in spirit

2nd Sorrow = Flight into Egypt

Gift = Piety

Beatitude = Blessed are the meek

3rd Sorrow = Loss of Jesus in the Temple

Gift = Knowledge

Beatitude = Blessed are they who mourn

4th Sorrow = Mary Meets Jesus on the Way to Calvary

Gift = Fortitude

Beatitude = Blessed are they who hunger

5th Sorrow = Mary Stands at the Foot of the Cross

Gift = Counsel

Beatitude = Blessed are the merciful

<u>6th Sorrow = Mary receives the Dead Body of Jesus in Her Arms</u>

Gift = Understanding

Beatitude = Blessed are the clean of heart

7th Sorrow = Jesus is Laid in the Tomb

Gift = Wisdom

Beatitude = Blessed are the peacemakers

Knights of Columbus 142nd Supreme Convention

The Knights of Columbus 142nd Supreme Convention took place in Quebec City, Canada, from August 6 to August 8. This annual worldwide meeting of the Knights of Columbus focused on our mission – building up the family and the Church. In his Annual Address, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly stated that the duty of Catholics and of Knights is to witness to the hope that comes from Jesus Christ. "Hope is at the heart of who we are," he said. "It led Father McGivney and the first Knights to band together, trusting that through them, our Lord would do great things. Hope led them to provide for widows and orphans. Hope led them to strengthen the family and defend the Church." Stressing the theme of the convention, Supreme Knight Kelly continued, "And like those first Knights, we trust in the Living God who holds the future in his hands. He will guide us, as he did our forefathers. And like them, he calls us to go on mission."

Florida Ballot Amendment 4

FLORIDA'S PRO-ABORTION AMENDMENT EXPLAINED

Why Floridians Should Vote NO on Amendment 4

Titled "Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion," Amendment 4 would enshrine **UNREGULATED ABORTION** in our state constitution, making Florida one of the **MOST PRO-ABORTION** states in the nation. The amendment language is **MISLEADING**, and its proposed outcomes are **DANGEROUS**.

WHAT IT SAYS

BALLOT SUMMARY

No law shall prohibit, penalize, delay, or restrict abortion

before viability

or when necessary to protect the patient's health,

as determined by the patient's healthcare provider.

This amendment does not change the Legislature's constitutional authority to require notification to a parent or guardian before a minor has an abortion.

WHAT IT DOES

PUTS WOMEN AT RISK

Amendment 4 would jeopardize existing laws and prohibit new ones that voters on both sides of the abortion issue support, including health and safety laws that protect women.

ALLOWS SECOND AND THIRD TRIMESTER ABORTIONS

Though not defined in the amendment, "viability" is defined in Florida law as the stage of development when the life of a fetus is sustainable outside the womb (Ch. 390.011(15)), generally accepted to be 22-24 weeks of pregnancy, or about 6 months.

CREATES A BROAD "HEALTH" LOOPHOLE

"Patient's health" is not defined in the amendment, allowing post-viability, extremely late-term abortions for treatable, temporary health concerns. Emotional health would justify an abortion when a child could survive outside the womb.

WEAKENS MEDICAL DOCTOR REQUIREMENT

"Healthcare providers" – not just physicians – could determine if an abortion is "necessary" to protect the mother's "health." Even some employees of abortion clinics, such as nurses and counselors, could approve late-term abortions.

ELIMINATES PARENTAL CONSENT

While preserving parental *notification* in our state constitution (Article X, Section 22), the amendment would invalidate the current law that requires parental *consent* for a minor to have an abortion (Ch. 390.01114(5)), making abortion the only medical decision for which parents have no say.
