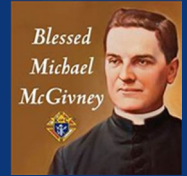

Knights of Columbus Supreme Council Update

Knights of Columbus 144th Supreme Convention: In the One, We are One.

More than 2,000 members of the Knights of Columbus from across the globe gathered for the 144th Supreme Convention focused on the theme “In the One, We Are One,” with an emphasis on the virtues of unity and charity. The Catholic fraternal organization’s annual convention was held from August 4 to 6 in Denver, Colorado. It included Masses, prayer services, an awards session recognizing member and council achievements, and a summary of the organization’s annual report.

The convention focused on the order’s principles of charity, unity, fraternity, and patriotism, opened with Mass celebrated by Archbishop James Golka of Denver along with dozens of bishops, hundreds of priests and deacons, and thousands of Knights and families. In his homily, Archbishop Golka shared his personal relationship with the Knights, as he is a fourth-degree Knight, his six brothers are Knights, and his late father was a Knight. In 2021, the year Golka was named bishop of Colorado Springs, his family was named Family of the Year by the Knights of Columbus Nebraska State Council.

“The Knights of Columbus exists to help our men grow in their faith, and they sure did for my dad,” Archbishop Golka said. “God wants the Knights of Columbus to help him care for his children. God wants the Knights of Columbus to help carry out God’s purposes. God wants the Knights of Columbus to live for God and God’s purposes, not ours,” he said. “And when we do that, we care for the people of God,” he said. “The Knights of Columbus empowers Catholic men to live their faith and serve their family, parish, community, and country,” he said. “But I think if I step back and look at the

Knights of Columbus, along with many other apostolates doing such good work, I think we’re all part of a bigger mission. The Knights of Columbus exist because God wants his world back,” he said.

In order to further this mission, we must “listen to God” and “beg God for clarity,” Archbishop Golka said. “He already has a plan for the Knights of Columbus. He has a plan for your council. He has a plan for your marriage and your family. We need to be experts in listening to him so we know what his plan is,” he said. “And brothers and sisters, whenever I look at Jesus to find out his plan, he is never anxious. He is never afraid. He’s excited to show us who he is,” Archbishop Golka said.

During the convention, Knights and observers also gathered for Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly’s presentation of the Annual Report, which highlighted the Knights’ work aiding the most vulnerable, and its

growing membership. “Just as Christ came to serve, we devote our lives to serving others, especially the vulnerable,” Kelly said. “All of our charity reflects the love of God. It’s a charity that evangelizes.”

The address included a comprehensive summary of the Knights of Columbus’ work over the past year, highlighting initiatives that have advanced the mission of the organization’s founder, Blessed Michael McGivney. “We are not just another charitable organization. We are not a social club,” Kelly said. “We are a global brotherhood of Catholic leaders and we are united in Jesus Christ. He is the true source of our strength. And as we reflect on our service over the past year, we give all the glory to God.” “Last year, our brother Knights devoted more than 48 million hours to volunteering,” Kelly said. “That’s 130,000 hours of volunteer service every day. And around the world, we donated more than \$200 million. And that’s a new record.”



Addressing some of the specific efforts, Kelly shared that “California Knights delivered more than 800 wheelchairs to the Philippines last year, and through this program, we’re serving refugees fleeing war, soldiers injured in the line of duty, and children with nowhere else to turn.” “We also serve children who need a warm jacket to get through the winter, and our Coats for Kids program is growing faster than ever. Last year, we gave more than 300,000 coats to children in need. That’s the most ever,” he said. He also detailed the Knights’ work aiding those affected by natural disasters, including the earthquakes in Venezuela in June and those in Jamaica.

Kelly discussed the growing number of men joining the Knights and how the organization is reaching new groups. “More than 2.2 million men now count themselves as Knights of Columbus, and last year we welcomed more than 105,000 new members. That’s the most growth we’ve had in more than a century since the surge that followed the first world war,” he said. “Last year, 15% of new members who joined in the United States and Canada were Hispanic, and our commitment to Latino communities has never been stronger,” he said. “Father McGivney also wanted to reach young men. The fastest-growing group of Knights is men under the age of 35. And we continue to reach young men during their college years. We now have more than 37,000 college Knights at 320 college councils,” he said.

Looking ahead, the Supreme Knight also shared new initiatives by the Knights intended to continue McGivney’s mission and further guide the fraternity’s members. “For years, we’ve heard ... from Knights about the need for a retreat for men,” Kelly said. The Knights responded by creating “Heart of the Gospel” in collaboration with ACTS XXIX. “It gives councils everything they need to hold a retreat for the men of the parish,” Kelly said. “This retreat will help you grow in your faith so you can witness to others.” To advance Knights’ faith, the Knights of Columbus also launched “Cor,” a small-group program “to give young men exactly what they are looking for — a community centered in Jesus Christ.” He also announced a new video series, “Encountering the Poor,” which is in partnership with Denver-based Christ in the City, to better equip Knights to serve the homeless.

Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge for September

Archbishop William Lori, Supreme Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus, each month selects a brief passage from the Gospel reading of one of the Sunday Masses, shares a brief reflection on the passage, and issues a challenge for men to live for the month. The Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge is suited for *Cor* or may be done individually. By taking up the Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge, men take direct, concrete action to grow in their faith and to help their brothers do so as well.

This month's Bible Verse:

Then Peter approaching asked him, "Lord, if my brother sins against me, how often must I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus answered, "I say to you, not seven times but seventy-seven times." (Gospel for Sept. 13, Mt 18:21-22). To forgive others can be very difficult at times, especially when someone repeatedly offends us. Jesus tells us there is no magic number that limits our obligation — our desire to forgive and show mercy to others must be boundless, just as God's mercy toward us is infinite. We pray in the Our Father, "Forgive us our trespasses *as we forgive those who trespass against us*." Our very salvation depends on our willingness to forgive, for God will forgive us in the measure that we forgive others (cf. Mt 6:14-15).

Challenge by the Supreme Chaplain:

This month, I challenge you to make a list of the people in your life — past and present — whom you find or have found difficult to forgive, and to sincerely pray for them each day.

Questions for Reflection:

Are there people in your life whom you find difficult to forgive for past offenses? Do you sometimes find yourself saying the words "I forgive you," but holding on to the hurt like a grudge? What steps can you take to move to true forgiveness?

U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops Update

U.S. Bishops' Initiative to Inform Communities on the Danger of Abortion Pills Includes Prayer, Education, and Advocacy

The U.S Conference of Catholic Bishops' (USCCB) Committee on Pro-Life Activities is inviting Catholics to join a focused effort of prayer and action to stop the spread of abortion pills. The initiative will take place August 18 through October 31, which includes the month-long commemoration of *Respect Life Month* observed each October by the Catholic Church in the United States.

"Every abortion involves the death of a child and harm to the mother," said Archbishop Paul S. Coakley, president of the USCCB, and Bishop Daniel E. Thomas, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities, in a joint invitation announcing the initiative. "Now with easier access to abortion pills, the abortion rate is tragically climbing, along with increased health risks."

In addition to invoking the intercession of *St. Joseph, Defender of Life*, participants can learn about the danger of abortion pills which have become accessible through telehealth appointments and at pharmacies, leading to increased risks to women, and the abortion rate tragically climbing. Participants of the initiative are encouraged to share

Vatican Update

Pope Leo says Sunday is 'foundation and kernel' of liturgical year

Pope Leo XIV urged Catholics to gather in person for Sunday Mass and called for working conditions that allow people to attend, saying Sunday is "the foundation and kernel of the whole liturgical year."

"To sanctify Sunday, it is essential to celebrate the Eucharist," the pope said at his Aug. 12 general audience in St. Peter's Basilica. "In this regard, I urge everyone to seek the best possible conditions so that even those who are unable to take time off work on Sundays may take part in Holy Mass."

Continuing his series on the documents of the Second Vatican Council, Pope Leo reflected on 'Sacrosanctum Concilium,' the Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy. The liturgical year is not a static representation of past events, but an ongoing encounter with Christ, he said. At its core is Easter, when Christ rose from the dead, and for that reason, the pope said, it is "essential for the faithful to sanctify the Lord's Day by gathering to celebrate the Eucharist." "May our active participation and steadfast witness help us to enter ever more deeply into the reality of belonging to Christ, and may we anticipate with hope his coming in glory," he said in his remarks to English-speaking pilgrims.

Pope Leo recalled St. John Paul II's description of Sunday as the "weekly Easter" and "the day of the Lord, the day of the Church, the day of man and, finally, the 'day of days.'" Even in languages such as English and German, where the name for Sunday refers to the "day of the sun," Pope Leo said Christians can discern a reference to Christ, "the true 'sun of righteousness' who enlightens every person."

Listening to the word of God, receiving the body of Christ and gathering together on Sundays, the pope said, allow "the Christian community" to make "visible its communion with the Lord" and bear witness to its fidelity to Christ and the Church. "This assembly cannot be substituted by a solely virtual presence, nor can it be reduced to a merely passive gathering," he said, stressing that the liturgical assembly is fulfilled through the active participation of the faithful.

Addressing Spanish-speaking pilgrims, Pope Leo also expressed his closeness to people affected by the powerful earthquake that struck western Colombia Aug. 10, killing hundreds and leaving many others injured or missing. Rescue efforts are still underway. "While I pray to the Lord for the eternal rest of the deceased, I assure you of my prayers for their families and all those affected by this tragedy," he said. "I express my gratitude to all those working in the rescue efforts and providing assistance to the victims."

Fourth Degree/Assembly 2901 Update

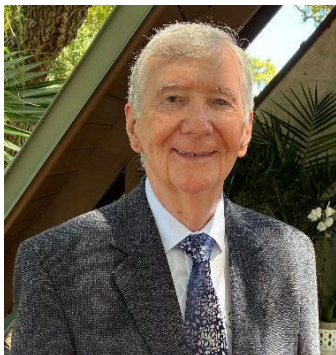

Icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

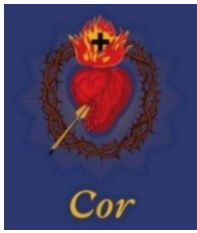
Upcoming Activities: Veterans; Adoration; Cor; Icon of the Sacred Heart of Jesus; Habitat; Breakfast

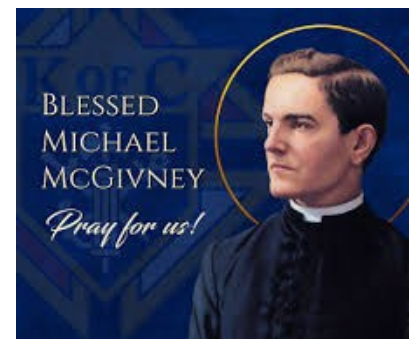
