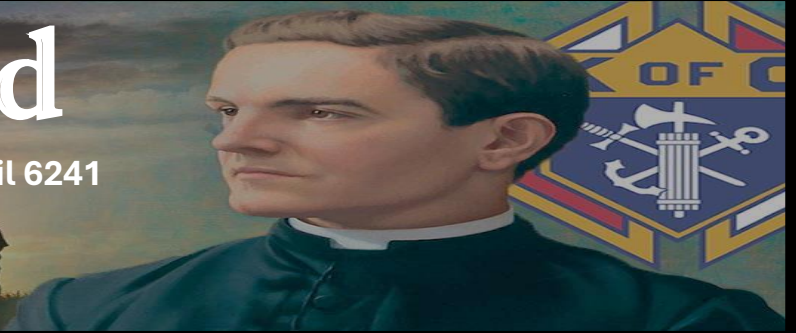

## The Story of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On November 1, 1950, Pope Pius XII defined the Assumption of Mary to be a dogma of faith: "We pronounce, declare and define it to be a divinely revealed dogma that the immaculate Mother of God, the ever Virgin Mary, having completed the course of her earthly life, was assumed body and soul to heavenly glory." The pope proclaimed this dogma only after a broad consultation of bishops, theologians and laity. There were few dissenting voices. What the pope solemnly declared was already a common belief in the Catholic Church.

We find homilies on the Assumption going back to the sixth century. In following centuries, the Eastern Churches held steadily to the doctrine, but some authors in the West were hesitant. However, by the 13th century there was universal agreement. The feast was celebrated under various names—Commemoration, Dormition, Passing, Assumption—from at least the fifth or sixth century. Today it is celebrated as a solemnity.

Scripture does not give an account of Mary's assumption into heaven. Nevertheless, Revelation 12 speaks of a woman who is caught up in the battle between good and evil. Many see this woman as God's people. Since Mary best embodies the people of both Old and New Testaments, her assumption can be seen as an exemplification of the woman's victory. Furthermore, in 1 Corinthians 15:20, Paul speaks of Christ's resurrection as the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep.

Since Mary is closely associated with all the mysteries of Jesus' life, it is not surprising that the Holy Spirit has led the Church to believe in Mary's share in his glorification. So close was she to Jesus on earth, she must be with him body and soul in heaven.

### Reflection

In the light of the Assumption of Mary, it is easy to pray her Magnificat (Luke 1:46–55) with new meaning. In her glory she proclaims the greatness of the Lord and finds joy in God her savior. God has done marvels to her, and she leads others to recognize God's holiness. She is the lowly handmaid who deeply revered her God and has been raised to the heights. From her position of strength, she will help the lowly and the poor find justice on earth, and she will challenge the rich and powerful to distrust wealth and power as a source of happiness.

# Bingo Update



## Bingo Update August

Bingo summer schedule is in swing. There are currently no off Sundays through the end of October. While I do expect crowds to lessen a bit as they normally do during summer, we expect to have our normal players with a few new ones sprinkled in. That being said, attendance is about 20 percent higher than last summer.

Kitchen upgrade has commenced and is expected to go through the first three weeks of July. I have requested water be restored for the weekend activities at the hall (or we would have no bingo). Depending on the status of the kitchen, grill activities will be relegated to a grill outside (belonging to the church) or potentially investing in a griddle. The grill will be in a standby location in the hall. It will need to be pulled out on Sunday morning and put back in storage after grill has been closed.

All Bingos will open the doors at noon on Sunday, and first game starts at 1:00 p.m. The games currently last until 4 to 4:15, so it is not an all-day affair.

Please consider volunteering to help with Bingo, especially during the summer months. Folks take vacations, and the ones here every week would like a bit of time off as well. We are looking for two additional cooks. They are at the hall by 11:30, and once the games start at 1, the grill is shutdown and kitchen is cleaned, and the chef can then leave. For callers and cashiers, their time is a bit more. Lead cashier needs to be there by 10:30 (to ensure they can get a parking spot), set the cashier tables up with early card sales help. Once the doors open, the main cashier sells the game packs, and once the games start, divvy out the money for the winners, and is there to close the books when Bingo is over. We are also looking for another member to come in early to help set up (from 10:20 until 1). Duties would involve setting up the tables for paper sales, turning on the Bingo machine and video equipment, and loading the bingo balls, validating all 75 balls are there, then dumping the balls and loading the first 50 balls for the first game. Easy to do, just need some help. Card sales can use some help, for 11:30 to 1, and afternoon floor help from 1pm to close.

If you can help, even once a month, it allows us to release people who volunteer **WEEK AFTER WEEK**. Please let me know. Again, other than the caller and main cashier, there is very little training that needs be done – like 5 minutes per station. If you are there, and there is only one cook in the kitchen, please lend a hand to him after bingo starts. Grill must be cooled and cleaned, and floor cleaned. And if you wanted to learn to call or cashier, we can always have standby's. Please help us keep alive the first pillar of the Knights of Columbus – Charity.

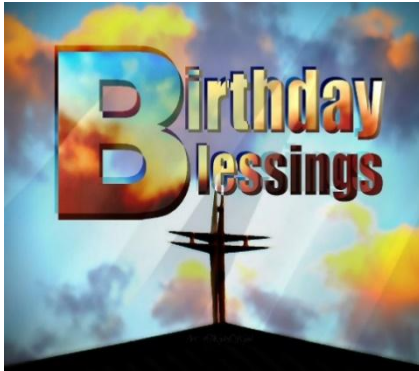

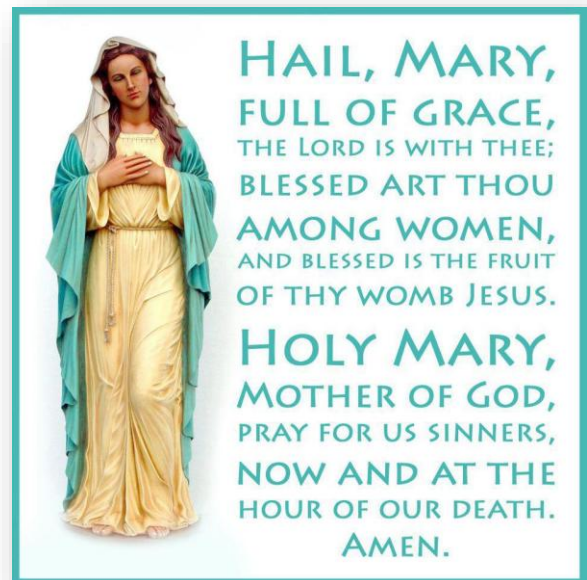
