Excellence: Leading by example and constantly striving to be the best.


Respect: Treating each other with the highest regard.

Bingo Update

We finally have (albeit slightly smaller) room for Bingo. The hall is about half sized, and we have been fortunate to have 70 to 80 players and have been able to have a good February. March will have three Sunday Bingo's, along with one Thursday Bingo.

We need to talk equipment. Our machine is quite old (am thinking about 25 years old or so), and it is beginning to give us some challenges. We are looking at replacing the machine with something more reliable and up to date. We have had some issues with the machine and camera/monitor in the last couple of months. Instead of the big bingo boards (which honestly, when not in use, are quite the eyesore), we are looking to replace the machine that is compatible with large screen TV's. They will be multi-use, as when Bingo is not in session they can be used by the church for religious education as well as other activities at the hall. Any purchases of this scale of equipment by the hall does require voting by the members. You cannot vote if you do not show up to the meetings.

If you have knowledge of newer bingo machines, please let me know.

Thanks again to the Women's Guild for helping to run food for the kitchen. They run the 50/50 and receive ALL profits from the 50/50 raffle.

The Men's club is also assisting once per month in the Kitchen helping cooking.

Does that mean we no longer need any help? **ABSOLUTELY NOT!** We are in need of an additional cook, would love to train a couple cashiers, and even an additional caller.

We can still use more help. Another grill specialist will fill the schedule. Another person trained to call, another cashier to float in, and even floor help would greatly be appreciated. Can you spare a couple hours per month helping out on either a Thursday or Sunday? Most of what we do involves very little training (excepting the main cashier and caller). If you like interacting with folks, we can ALWAYS use floor help from a bit after noon to close. Cannot stand for long? Our table guys (and on Thursday -table gals), are able to sit and sell different paper we use for BINGO.

Finally, I wish to thank you all for the prayers for my wife Diane, it's been a tough couple of months, and is more the reason that we can use some more hands. Thanks to Grand Knight Vinny Burdo, Worthy Warden Don Sheetz, and Ed Skupeen for helping me focus on caring for my wife and be relieved of some Bingo responsibilities.


