
Grand Knights Message

Bingo Update



Bingo Update May

Bingo will resume in full swing in May, and there are currently no off Sundays through the end of October. While I do expect crowds to lessen a bit as they normally do during summer, we expect to have our normal players with a few new ones sprinkled in.

While most of the upgrades to the hall have been completed, the Kitchen is still in the works. What this means is that while we can still have Bingo, our ability to cook food on premise may be limited. I would expect during the June/July time frame, the kitchen refurbishment will be ongoing.

All Bingos will open the doors at noon on Sunday, and first game starts at 1:00 p.m. The games currently last until 4 to 4:15, so it is not an all-day affair.

Please consider volunteering to help with Bingo, especially during the summer months. Folks take vacations, and the ones here every week would like a bit of time off as well. We are looking for two additional cooks. They are at the hall by 11:30, and once the games start at 1, the grill is shut down and kitchen is cleaned, and the chef can then leave. For callers and cashiers, their time is a bit more. Lead cashier needs to be there by 10:30 (to ensure they can get a parking spot), set the cashier tables up with early card sales help. Once the doors open, the main cashier sells the game packs, and once the games start, divvy out the money for the winners, and is there to close the books when Bingo is over. We are also looking for another member to come in early to help set up (from 10:20 until1). Duties would involve setting up the tables for paper sales, turning on the Bingo machine and video equipment, and loading the bingo balls, validating all 75 balls are there, then dumping the balls and loading the first 50 balls for the first game. Easy to do, just need some help. Card sales can use some help, for 11:30 to 1, and afternoon floor help from 1pm to close.



Again, other than the caller and main cashier, there is very little training that needs be done – like 5 minutes per station. If you are there, and there is only one cook in the kitchen, please lend a hand to him after bingo starts. Grill must be cooled and cleaned, and floor cleaned. And if you wanted to learn to call or cashier, we can always have standby's. Please help us keep alive the first pillar of the Knights of Columbus – Charity.


Passion of Christ St. Joseph

Memorial Day

The Memorial Day weekend has become an occasion for family get-togethers, visits to friends, events and short vacations. The parades are followed by fireworks, picnics, parties and BBQs. It has become a busy travel weekend, leading to congestion on highways and in airports. The holiday is also associated with the Indianapolis 500 car race, which is held on the Sunday preceding Memorial Day.

As the day has become less of an occasion of remembrance in recent years, its original meaning is in danger of becoming lost. To counter this, the <u>National Moment of</u> <u>Remembrance</u> was created in 2000 - an annual event that invites all Americans to pause for the duration of one minute at 3:00 p.m. local time on Memorial Day to honor those who have lost their lives while serving the country.

Memorial Day is not to be confused with <u>Veterans Day</u> (November 11) which honors and remembers all those who have *previously* served in the United States Armed Forces, and <u>Armed Forces</u> <u>Day</u> (third Saturday in May), an unofficial holiday that honors those *currently* serving in the armed forces.

Memorial Day is preceded by <u>National</u> <u>Poppy Day</u>, which is held on the Friday before the Memorial Day weekend. The red poppy is the official flower and symbol of Memorial Day and the national emblem of remembrance.

Other countries commemorate their war dead on November 11. The holiday takes different names - in the UK, Canada and a number of Commonwealth States it is referred to as <u>Remembrance Day</u>, while in France it is called <u>Armistice Day</u>. This custom is different in the US because Memorial Day predates Veterans Day.

Deacon Jedidiah Preble.

At the liturgy March 29, 2025, Preble was ordained a transitional deacon with other students from St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary as they move toward priestly ordination next year. Presiding at the ordination was Archbishop Thomas Wenski of Miami, accompanied by other bishops and clergy.

A native of Brazil, Preble is the fifth of seven children born to an American father and mother from Argentina. Although he is 41 years old, he said, "I am not a 'late vocation' because I was always attracted to the liturgy and the priesthood and I served at the altar when I was young, living in Silver Springs, Maryland, and as an adolescent living in Argentina." Throughout his early life, Preble attended schools whose spiritual formation had been entrusted to the Opus Dei personal prelature. "I would also take part in their formation activities outside of school," he said. "This is how I became acquainted with St. Josemaría Escriva's teachings regarding divine filiation and the universal call to holiness. In addition to this, Marian devotion and sacred music have been central to my spiritual life." After earning a bachelor's degree in philosophy from the University of Dallas, he discerned a calling with the Franciscan Friars of the Immaculate in Binghamton, New York, and in 2018 entered seminary for the Diocese of Dallas. His parents had been in the Delray Beach-Boca Raton area since 2002 and had developed personal ties to the Diocese of Palm Beach. "I used to go to Mass at St. Joan of Arc and visit the adoration chapel at St. Vincent Ferrer during breaks from college," Preble said. "In 2021, I decided to transfer from the Diocese of Dallas to the Diocese of Palm Beach and I enrolled at St. Vincent de Paul Regional Seminary in Boynton Beach."

Preble, whose given name is Alpha Jorge Jedidiah Preble, spoke to the Florida Catholic prior to the ordination Mass about his excitement at becoming a deacon and continuing his journey toward priesthood. He said it was "a lot like, I would imagine, someone would feel like when they're getting married. I feel a lot like that." (Jedidiah Preble is one of the four seminarians receiving a stipend from council 6241 to assist in daily needs.)


