A new school year has begun, Fall is upon us, we're still not through Hurricane Season, and some of our Northern families have started to return to FL. Your Council 6241 was hard at work in the month of September. Three large things we accomplished in September

1. We launched our Catholic HS Scholarship Program to fund Students seeking to attend a Catholic HS in the Diocese of Palm Beach. There will be 10 scholarships of \$3,000 per student to be earned by students entering their 9<sup>th</sup> thru 12<sup>th</sup> year of HS for the school year of September 2026 thru May of 2027. Packets of information are being delivered to our 3 parishes in October. It is our intention to continue to fund this program for \$30,000 annually going forward.
2. On the evening of September 29<sup>th</sup> our council prepared a wonderful dinner for Bishop Barbarito and 20 Priests from Palm Beach Diocese. A good time was had by all; photos are contained in this month's Shield.
3. We are actively beginning our preparation for the KofC Annual Bob Ward Thanksgiving Meal Distribution. We will be cooking and preparing meals from Mon 11/24 thru Wed 11/26 for delivery on Thanksgiving morning from 8-11:30 AM. All work will be done at St. Joseph's Parish. We will need many volunteers to successfully deliver approximately 1,000 meals for those in our communities who are suffering hard times. # Bingo Update



## Bingo Update October

Bingo fall schedule started and seemed a bit like the summer schedule. There are currently no off Sundays until November 2, when the Women's Guild sponsors a craft show. While attendance is up this year, it is not possible to predict when our winter visitors will be back, as last year the hall was closed down for a few months.

Kitchen upgrade is just about complete. Fire Marshall had to inspect the suppression system, as two double fryers were added, and that changed the requirements. While the griddle may be available for cooking, if the chefs want to use the outside grill, it will be available. The grill is in a standby location in the hall. It will need to be pulled out Sunday morning and put back in storage after bingo concludes in the afternoon. The nice thing is that folks smell the burgers and dogs cooking (and liked the aroma).

Bingo doors open at noon on Sunday, and first game starts at 1:00 p.m. The games currently last until 4 to 4:15, so it is not an all-day affair.

**Please consider volunteering to help with Bingo**, especially during the summer months. Folks take vacations, and the ones here every week would like a bit of time off as well. We are looking for **two additional cooks**. They are at the hall by 11:30, and once the games start at 1, the grill is shutdown and kitchen is cleaned, and the chef can then leave. For callers and cashiers, their time is a bit more. Lead cashier needs to be there by 10:30 (to ensure they can get a parking spot), set the cashier tables up with early card sales help. Once the doors open, the main cashier sells the game packs, and once the games start, divvy out the money for the winners, and is there to close the books when Bingo is over. We are also looking for another member to come in early to help set up (from 10:20 until 1). Duties would involve setting up the tables for paper sales, turning on the Bingo machine and video equipment, and loading the bingo balls, validating all 75 balls are there, then dumping the balls and loading the first 50 balls for the first game. Easy to do, just need some help. Card sales can use some help, for 11:30 to 1, and afternoon floor help from 1pm to close.

If you can help, even once a month, it allows us to release people who volunteer **WEEK AFTER WEEK**. Please let me know. Again, other than the caller and main cashier, there is very little training that needs be done – like 5 minutes per station. And if you want to learn to call or cashier, we can always have standby's. Please help us keep alive the first pillar of the Knights of Columbus – Charity.

# Jubilee Year Pilgrimage at the Cathedral of St Ignatius Loyola Palm Beach Gardens

The Central doors, marked by the banner and the relief of the bronze doors at the St Peter's (Vatican City) are the designated holy doors at the Cathedral.

The group assembles outside in the courtyard and processes through the holy doors with their pilgrim cross (if they have one) and proceed to the Sanctuary.

On the right-hand side of the Sanctuary is the official diocesan pilgrim cross. The pilgrims arrange themselves in the pews on the right-hand side and recite the Jubilee prayers for the intentions of the Holy Father.

The Holy Father's intentions are:

- **September:** For the promotion of peace and reconciliation in areas of conflict.
- **October:** For the protection of creation and for the care of our common home.

The prayers recited are the Apostles Creed, the Our Father, Hail Mary, and Glory Be

To obtain indulgence, the pilgrim must receive the Eucharist and go to Confession within 30 days (before or after) making the pilgrimage.

## What is an indulgence?

An indulgence is the remission of the temporal punishment incurred for sin. Penance and Absolution cleanse the sinner of the spiritual punishment; an indulgence remits the temporal punishment. Think about "indulgence" as being granted parole (early release from prison) or an executive pardon (governor/president) for one's crimes. One is guilty of a crime, one may be forgiven by the priest, but a temporal punishment is still carried out. An indulgence remits temporal punishment.

You may offer the indulgence for yourself, a family member (living or deceased), or any friend (living or deceased). Each time you make the pilgrimage you gain an extra indulgence and can apply this indulgence to various individuals.

## Stained-Glass windows

The stained-glass windows in the Cathedral along the entrance depict the Twelve Apostles. There is a large Good Shepherd stained-glass window on the right-hand side by the choir area. At the entrance of the Cathedral is a stained-glass window of the Tree of Life decorated with leaves listing all the parishes of the Diocese of Palm Beach.

The statue of Saint Ignatius Loyola is on the right-hand side by the organ pit; as well as a large statue of the Blessed Mother along the wall.

The wooden reredos (wood paneling) along the back to the Sanctuary is Black Walnut from Germany. The sanctuary appointments (tabernacle, candles, etc) are from Spain, and the marble is from Italy.

The Cathedra (Bishop's chair) is located on the right-hand side of the Sanctuary and has the bishop's crest: *Veritatem Facientes in Caritate* (Living the Truth in Love, Ephesians 4:15)

In the center of the sanctuary floor you will find the large Greek letters: IC XC/NI KA. IC XC stands for Jesus Christos and NIKA means conqueror .

The marble itself is a mosaic, with various colored marble sections arranged to form artistic symbols and designs.

The Chapel of our Lady, Queen of the Apostles, is located through the left-hand side doors of the Cathedral in the back. There is a large, bejeweled icon of the Blessed Mother, Queen of the Apostles, as well as various depictions of the Blessed Mother around the chapel.

The Chapel furnishings (altar back drop, candle sticks, statues) were purchased by St Jude (Tequesta) from a former church building and repurposed for the Diocese of Palm Beach.

The "stained glass" windows in the chapel are film appliques that simulate stained glass.

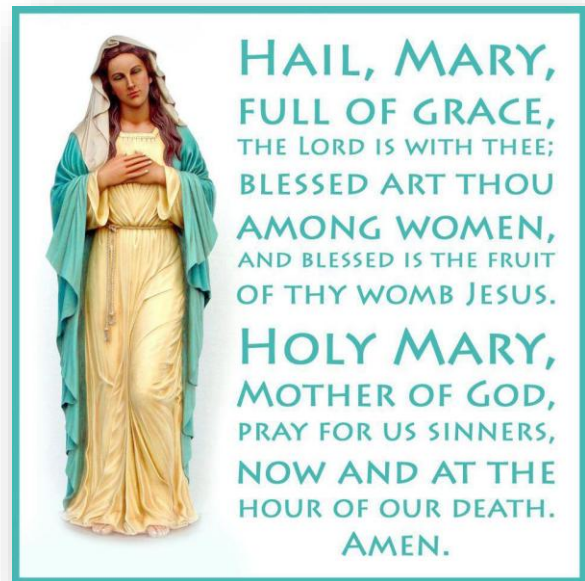
