THESE MEN THEY CALL KNIGHTS

Worthy Brothers,

The start of the new year comes with changes to the Knights of Columbus Degree program. If you have not heard, there are no longer three degrees but only one degree. The Admission (1st), Formation (2nd), and Brotherhood (3rd) degrees have been absorbed into one degree. The 3 principles of our order Charity, Unity and Fraternal are still the core of the new degree. However the 3 principles will be bestowed upon the new member at the new exemplification ceremony.

Supreme Knight Carl Anderson had an article in the recent Columbia magazine explaining the reasons for the changes to the Degree program and the Exemplification's ceremony. He mentioned there is a crisis in our Church and that crisis is a lack of evangelization. The Church has seen some astonishing numbers in the past 50 years with people leaving the Church and the diminishing number of sacramental marriages and baptisms which have fallen off by 40% and weekly Mass attendance has dropped from 50% to 20%. The Church is changing and that's why changes are being made with the Knights of Columbus.

The current degrees are a product of the late 19th century where fraternal societies competed and men wanted secrecy and multiple stages of progression in their order. The men of today are not the men of the 1880's or for that fact the men of the 1980's, so a change had to be made to attract more men. There were other things for the change such as members were not advancing any further than the first and second degrees and there was a lack of ceremonial teams and ceremonies that were time-consuming and difficult to attend. Therefore, the current system fell short in promoting all the principles of our order to have truly a Catholic fraternal membership. With no vision of things improving in the years to come, this change was implemented to bring in men that we need and men who need us. Our core principles have not changed. It's just that our core principles will be taught at the first exemplification ceremony and the member can practice a Catholic way of life as it was meant to be with the 3 degrees.

So, the crisis in the Church that the Supreme Knight was referring to is lack of evangelization. He is asking the Knights of Columbus to rise up and meet this challenge, to become again a Church that evangelizes. In future, you will be seeing more emphasis on our Faith In Action programs. We are men who are acting in our faith helping children and families and also meeting the spiritual needs of our men and our Catholic families.

Hope everyone's year got off to a good start. Our Fraternal year is half over and there is still a lot of work to do before the year is over. If you haven't helped with any of our fundraising events this year, I encourage you to do so before the year is over. The Tootsie Roll Drive is scheduled next month and a good charity to be a part of. Remember our first principle is Charity.

reminder of our Christian commitment to respect the dignity of all human life. If you would be interested in placing the rose before Mass please contact **Don DePasquale at 561.487.3366**


