Parish Renovation Projects:

This past year the pandemic has been disruptive to our normal way of life and to the charitable works that we do as council throughout the year. The Saturday morning food distribution with Boca Helping Hands at the Glades Baptist Church were eliminated, the tootsie roll drives at Old Navy and the church were eliminated, the awards program at the Equine Assisted Therapies was cancelled, Special Olympics County Bowling Championship and Summer Games were cancelled, Habitat for Humanity events were cancelled, our annual church dinners and pancake breakfasts were postponed, but maybe there is some good to come from this pandemic. The pandemic enable the church and the council to look for other opportunities to do things right here around the church.

In September, Father Dominic handed Grand Knight Ted a list of items that needed to be repaired or corrected around the Church. These items didn't require high technical skills, but just ordinary every day hard work. At first GK Ted thought that this work would be difficult for the council to accomplished since the council had never done this kind of work before, but as time went along, more and more items got completed. Now after six months most if not all the work has been completed. Here is a list of things that the council has done:

- Sidewalks around the Church and Parish Hall were pressure washed.
- Wheel stops in the parking areas were cleaned.
- Equipment shed was built to house the lawn mowers and gas supplies.

Purchased and installed sturdier metal shelving for the Storage Room in the

Parish Hall.







- Landscape the church grounds with new mulch.
- Anchored the statues and secured the benches in the Prayer Garden.

GK Ted estimated that the work included above saved the Church approximately \$13,360, if the Church were to contract this work to outside services.





Christmas Wreaths:

The Christmas wreath sale was very profitable in the amount \$1,637.00. The money received will be used to offset the costs for the Parish Renovation projects. Special thanks to the Ladies of St. John's who helped show brother knights how to make a good-looking wreath. There was some wreath making materials left over so the material will be saved for next year. In addition, new year an advent wreath may be added for possible sale.

Christmas Eve Mass:

Currently, our Parish has live video streaming. This year due to the COVID-19 social distancing requirements, the Pavilion was turned into an overflow area for the Church at all the Christmas Eve Masses. The council would like thank all the brothers knights who helped with setting up this area and who served as ushers during the Christmas Eve Masses. So COVID-19 has challenged us to come up with new and inventive ways to bring the message of God and to best utilize our church facilities.
