

A MESSAGE FROM THE GRAND KNIGHT

GREETINGS FROM OUR FIELD AGENT




Dear Brother Knights and Family.


TOOTSIE ROLL DRIVE







THANKSGIVING BASKETS FOR MIGRANT WORKER FAMILIES **NOVEMBER 2024**





WHO WAS FR. JOHN H. PATRICK?

Knights of Columbus Father John H. Patrick Council 13207





Rev. Fr. John Harry Patrick Chaplain, Colonel/USAF Retired 1934 - 2002

Fr. Patrick was born on June 11, 1934, in Westernport, Maryland, the son of the late Hobart & Mary (Cullen) Patrick. He was one of three children, having a brother late Hobart & Mary (Cullen) and a sister Evelyn Wilson. He was a Third James (who preceded him to the Lord) and a sister Evelyn Wilson.

Degree member of the Knights of Columbus.

Fr. Patrick graduated from St. Peter's High School, in Westernport, in 1952; and then attended St. Charles College in Baltimore, Maryland followed by St. Mary's then attended St. Charles College in Baltimore, Maryland followed as an Assistant Seminary, also in Baltimore. He was ordained in 1961 and assigned as an Assistant Priest at St. Cecilia's Parish, where he served until 1965. After his four (4) years of Parish Duties, Fr. Patrick decided to spend some time in the Military Service. After Parish Duties, Fr. Patrick decided to spend some time in the United States Air Force, twenty-three (23) years of serving as a Chaplain, in the United States Air Force, Patrick retired with the rank of Colonel, in 1988. He served at numerous Air Force Patrick retired with the rank of Colonel, in 1988. He served at numerous Air Force Bases throughout the United States and overseas. During his military career he attended many courses given by the US Air Force, including his graduation from the

Upon his retirement from the Air Force he decided to take up residence in Gainesville, FL, although he had never spent any time in this area. He became a member of Queen of Peace Catholic Church, which had just been started in 1987. Fr. member of Queen of Peace to help out as a volunteer assistant, and Fr. J. 




Prayer for the Canonization of Blessed Michael McGivney

BRIEF SUMMARY OF MAJOR RESPONSIBILITIES OF ELECTED OFFICERS IN KOFC COUNCIL

Grand Knight

- Presides over all meetings
- Appoints program and membership directors
- Appoints committees as needed
- Ensures the submission of all paperwork required by the Supreme and State Councils
- Has a working knowledge of the kofc.org website,
 Officers Online and Member Management
- Maintains working relationships with the council's chaplain, district deputy, field agent and general agent, as well as with other local service organizations

Deputy Grand Knight

- Assists the GK with operation of the council and duties assigned by GK
- When GK not present, presides at council meetings

Chancellor

- Has the duty of strengthening the members' interest in council activities
- Recommended to serve on the council's Admission Committee

Treasurer

- Receives money from Financial Secretary and deposits it in the proper council accounts
- Responsible for paying all council expenses, including assessments from the Supreme Council

Recorder

 Responsible for keeping and maintaining a true and permanent record of all actions of the council

Advocate

- Acts as parliamentarian for the council
- Should have a working knowledge of Robert's Rules of Order, Charter, Constitution & Laws, council bylaws, and Method of Conducting Council Meetings

Warden

- Responsible for supervising and maintaining all council property
- Sets up council chambers for meetings and degree exemplifications

Inside/Outside Guards

 Attend the doors of the council chamber, checking for current membership cards and allowing entrance

Board of Trustees

- Consists of GK and three other elected members
- Supervises all financial business of the council and conducts the semiannual audits
- Elected for terms of three years, two years and one year and, at each regular election, the position of each trustee will be voted upon, moving up one position
