GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE

Brother Knights and Ladies,

I want to start by thanking everyone who participated in, supported or otherwise helped with the 'Memorial Gold McTournament (see article later in this Vessel). We had a great day, and some 18 Knights and spouses participated as volunteers. Many, Many Thanks!!

My second topic is very serious one. I have agreed to remain as your Grand Knight, and I have an almost complete roster of Officers and Directors for 2022-2023. I have two glaring needs for someone to step forward:

Recorder – After 4 years as Recorder, Mark Perrault is stepping down, and we need someone to step forward to take the minutes of our General Meetings. This is a critical position that requires attendance at all Membership meetings and the ability to translate notes into Minutes. It is not a transcriber job – you do not need to capture conversations, discussions or debates. You do need to capture motions and votes, plus major events (planned or completed). We no longer take notes by hand in the Recorder book. The recorder uses their tablet or laptop to type notes and then converts those notes to minutes at home, with a beer on the table next to them (I just made that up).

Future Grand Knight- normally, the Deputy Grand Knight is the "Grand Knight in Training", but Council 5958 hasn't followed that path for a number of years. For instance, I moved from Financial Secretary to Grand Knight. At this point, I have approached several of our most active Knights to commit



Saint of the Month:

JAMES THE LESS, APOSTLE

James was given the nickname “the Less” so that he would not be confused with the other Apostle named James, whose feast we celebrate on July 25. We believe that it means that he was younger than the other St. James, who was called “the Greater.” James the Less was the son of Alphaeus. His mother stood at the Cross with Mary on the day Jesus was crucified.

After Jesus’ Ascension, James the Less became an important part of the Church’s growth in Jerusalem. Tradition tells us that he led an important meeting of the early Church, the Council of Jerusalem, in the year 50 AD. At this meeting, St. Paul, St. Peter, and other Church leaders discussed whether Gentiles, or people who were not Jewish, could become followers of Jesus. James listened carefully to the discussion and helped the group to decide that the Church was open to all and that all people could be saved by living as followers of Jesus.

Like Philip, James was martyred for spreading the Gospel. We honor Philip and James the Less as saints on May 3. Their lives of faith inspire us to listen for the Lord’s call in our lives and to respond with love and faith.

We again had a robust group of culinary experts – some 15 people in all, including guests from the Women's Council and parish member guests. Easter Egg Hunt - On Easter Sunday the Knights, led by brother Jim Valentine, put on the Annual Easter Egg Hunt after the 9:00am and 1:00pm Masses. The Valentine family (Julie, Janet Jim), plus brothers Sal Aprile (& Giana), Joe Clarke, Leonardo Silva, Jose Alcanrava, Ray Standard, Tom Wilhelm and Bob Valentine all helped after the 9:00 am Mass, and Eric Rodriguez assisted after the 1:00 pm Mass. 111 children in total hunted for eggs after the two Masses. SJVS Awards Presentation – On Wednesday, April 27, at the 8:30 School Mass, the awards for all the Youth Programs run by the Knights were presented to the school children. Memorial Golf McTournament

April 23rd



This is an April Event, but it deserves its' own heading! On April 23rd, Council 5958 held its' first Golf Tournament in 3 years. This Tournament, initially named in honor of John McGivern, has historically been one of our best Fundraisers. Then a couple of things happened: first the sudden death of Joe McManus, one of the prime organizers of the event, and then the death of the event itself, as everything shut down due to Covid. This year, under the leadership of Joe Clark, we were able to resurrect the event. When it started we didn't know what to expect. Could we get golfers? Could we get sponsors? Could we get a Golf Course? In the past the event had been held at Hunter's Creek Golf course, but we found out that course was shut down. Joe found a Course (Kissimmee Bay), assembled a team to beat the bushes for Sponsors and Donations, and basically devoted a good portion of his life for the next 3 months in pursuit of reviving the Tournament. The Tournament was renamed from the John McGivern Memorial to honor both John and Joe McManus – thus the McTournament!

To make a long story short, the McTournament was a rousing success – far beyond our expectations and hopes! While the final figures are not in, we appear to have made in the neighborhood of \$7,000 for our charities! We had 84 Golfers, and \$1,000 donations from Dan Newlin, the McGivern Family, and an anonymous donor. 18 Knights, spouses and friends volunteered their time on the day of the event, and Joe plus the 4 members of his team (Jim Jetmore, Jim Valentine, Alan Schlagter, Mark Bassett) secured 23 Hole Sponsors and close to 100 gift cards/discount coupons from local businesses (especially restaurants)! God provided a perfect day weather-wise, and to top it off, the Dan Newlin Helicopter flew in at 7:30 am just as the Tournament was getting ready to start. It landed, and stayed for photo opportunities until almost 2:00 pm. As one of the Staff at Kissimmee Bay said: "Absolutely over the top!" That sums up the entire day, and the entire event! I would have to say the Golf Tournament is back!
