

OUR LENTEN JOURNEY - ASH WEDNESDAY TO HOLY THURSDAY



As our journey of Lent begins, we Catholics, like Christians everywhere, prepare to commemorate the passion of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Just a few short weeks ago, we celebrated his birth, and now the church begins our preparation to join Him on His journey to Calvary. The church scene becomes somber, more intense, and such terms as contrition, conversion, penance, almsgiving, fasting and abstinence dominate the liturgy.

Fasting and abstinence are church-imposed penitential practices that deny us food and drink during the Lenten season. These acts of self-denial allow us to free ourselves from worldly distractions and focus our attention on our own spiritual growth and resurrection.

Our Founder, Blessed Michael McGivney provides us with a guideline for our Lenten journey through the 3 Principles of our Order: Charity, Unity, and Fraternity. CHARITY boils down to Almsgiving, with UNITY as Prayer, and FRATERNITY as Fasting and Abstinence. The practice of these 3 Principles can lead us to a more meaningful Lenten experience.

As an example, the last of these principles is FRATERNITY. As Knights, we value the brotherhood and solidarity that each of us share with our families. We know that sustaining that spirit of solidarity may require patience and forbearance. Sometimes, we need to abstain from a hasty word or an angry remark. Often, we need to make room in our hearts for a Brother Knight with whom we disagree. In other words, we need to "fast" from a disparaging remark which would undermine our FRATERNITY.

Another example of FRATERNITY during Lent is found in denying ourselves food and drink. This sacrifice will also help us to make more room in our hearts for one another, as well as for those in need, and ultimately for our risen-Savior.



Holy Week starts with Palm Sunday when Jesus enters the city of Jerusalem. This week leads us through the Last Supper, His crucifixion, and ends on Easter Sunday with His resurrection. This is the basis of Christianity, His sacrifice launched the New Covenant God promised to us and to all Christians throughout the world.

Brother Larry Hall was awarded this month's Knight of the Month given his leadership, dedication, and commitment to our Council as Financial Secretary!




FAMILY OF MONTH - GARY & MARGOT ELLIS -

2024 SPRING TRAINING BASEBALL SEASON GETS OFF TO A GREAT START!

On Saturday, February 24th, the Baltimore Orioles opened their 2024 Spring Training Season against the Boston Red Sox. And St. Thomas Council 7826 and Incarnation Council 15332 began their 13th consecutive year jointly operating a concession stand at Ed Smith Stadium.

What an Opening Day! The weather was sunny and bright, and Ed Smith Stadium was filled with a sellout crowd of 7,920 fans. To make the day a success, the Orioles won the game with a walk-off 2-run homer in the bottom of the ninth inning for a 4-3 victory.

St. Thomas More and Incarnation Councils also had a great day at their Outdoor Patio Grill Concession Stand. For the fourth year, the stand sold hamburgers, cheeseburgers, hot dogs, sausage with peppers and onions, draft beer, soda, water, popcorn, potato chips, cracker jacks and peanuts. And sell they did! During a four-hour period, the stand served 501 customers and generated \$12,748.75 in sales. At the end of the day, the stand earned \$1,181.98 in commissions and \$1,461.94 in tips for a total of \$2,643.92. What a great start to the 16-game schedule.

In the last week of February, the Orioles played the Tampa Bay Rays, Detroit Tigers and the Pittsburgh Pirates. March starts off with a game against the New York Yankees, which should be a sellout. The Orioles will also play the Atlanta Braves, Boston Red Sox, Detroit Tigers, Minnesota Twins, Philadelphia Phillies, Pittsburgh Pirates, Tampa Bay Rays and Toronto Blue Jays. The season concludes on Saturday night, March 23rd.

GOLF COMMITTEE UPDATE -

Our 3rd Annual K of C Council 7826 Golf Outing - to be held on May 6th of 2024 has a change of venue!

We have been advised that Legacy GC is in the process of being sold to the Heritage Golf Group (they also own TPC Prestancia) and will become a private club. It is anticipated the course will close in early-mid March for a period of time to allow the new owner to bring the course up to their standard. Our golf outing originally scheduled at Legacy GC has been moved to Sereona GC.

WGK Ralph Neller has negotiated with the principal of Serenoa Golf Course (sister course to Legacy GC), as to change our venue and to maintain the date of May 6th of 2024. Our golf outing will now be held at the Serenoa GC.

As of this writing, we are collecting all monies from the major sponsors, hole sponsors and golfers. We have advised all the golf teams / golfers of the change of venue, and we do anticipate some dilution of these golfers / teams. As of now, we are at full capacity of 28 teams or 112 golfers. We will respond to any change, if needed, due to the change of venue.



The Golf Committee has done a yeoman's job re: hole sponsors, major sponsors, golf teams et al as well as items for the goodie bags, raffle baskets and auction items.

Volunteers for the event have been confirmed, however, they too, have been notified of the venue change.

Simply said - we will need ASAP to work with the Serenoa administration on all aspects of the outing. As you can imagine we will have a lot of work to do between now and May 6th to make this a successful event. Yet, we have the full cooperation and capacity of Serenoa GC and its staff - and our golf outing has been well received by this group as to proceed on our behalf.

We still need all Brother Knights to consider being a hole sponsors - you or a business that you know, in your family's name, in memory of or any other recognition that is desired - to be placed on the golf course as a hole sponsor sign - donation is \$100 per sign.
