A message from the Grand Knight





Worthy Brothers,

There are some great things going on in March which you can become involved in.

First, our Lenten Fish Fry is now in the third week. The first two weeks have been a success because of our volunteers. Brother Knights and their wives and the Columbiettes have been volunteering their time to bring our church community and other communities the best fish fry in Lakeland. We could use more Knights, especially in the dining room serving our guests. We have great help from the Columbiettes and wives but need to have more Knights visible. Other Knights of Columbus Councils are running Fish Frys with just Knights. I know our Council could do this also if we wanted to. Come on out for a Friday or two. The compliments you get from our guests are great!

On Tuesday nights at 6:30 in the Parish Hall is a five part series on the Eucharist. The first two weeks have been very interesting. It brings readings from the Old Testament with the Gospel to show you where the history of today's Eucharist came to be in our Mass. Brother Knights Jay Bice and Daniel Wagner are leading this series which is sponsored by the Knights. Many Catholic leaders including our own Bishop has declared that this year we should focus on the Eucharist and its meaning. This is a great way to do just that. Just because the first two weeks are over doesn't mean you can't attend. Each week new topics are discussed. Again, this is on Tuesday nights, starts right at 6:30 and ends by 8:30. Refreshments are provided by the Knights.

The 9th and 10th of March is the second weekend of The Tootsie Roll Drive. If you haven't signed up, email Bob Renna to volunteer. We are the only council in Lakeland doing this event. Why do we do this every year? Every penny we collect goes to Special Olympics and ROAR (formerly known as Noah's Ark). Both these organizations do a fantastic job working with special needs children and adults. ROAR is right here in Lakeland and is an incredible organization. Again, every penny that we collect goes to these two organizations. Our Council also donates to what is collected. A couple of hours of your time could make a big difference to a special needs child or adult. When people come out of a Publix store they are happy to help in this cause. We don't ask you to twist anyone's arm to donate.

One last thing that has been rolled out last month is our new website. Our name is KOFC2505.org. We are just getting it rolling. Things you can see and do right now: see over 300 pictures of our 100^{Th} Anniversary Celebration, view Council Officers and email them, there will be a library of newsletters, a calendar of upcoming events, and, in the members only section, you can see members' birthdays, email any member in our Council, record your volunteer hours after every event so you don't have to try and remember them at the end of the year, nominate a Family of the Month, and much more. Hello Brother Knights of Council 2505: This message is for those of you whom have not yet attained your 4th Degree. Please see below the schedule of 4th Degree Exemplifications scheduled in 2024 here in Florida.

May 11th, 2024 (Saturday) Saint John the Evangelist Catholic Church in Naples, Fla. Naples is about a 2 1/2 to 3 hour drive from Lakeland. It is just south of Ft. Myers.

June 15th 2024 (Saturday) Church of the Little Flower in Coral Gables, Fla; Coral Gables is near Miami.

August 25th 2024 (Saturday) San Juan del Rio Catholic Church in St. John, Fla (St. John is just south of Jacksonville, Fl and is about 190 miles from Lakeland (about a 3-4 hour drive).

The Exemplification is now open for wives and family members to attend the exemplification ceremony.

The first Sessions of "Lectio: Eucharist" were attended by over two dozen people on February 20, 2024 at Saint Joseph Parish Hall, Lakeland, Florida. Hosted by the Knights of Columbus, Council #2505, the attendees were Knights, the Saint Joseph Columbiettes, Saint Joseph staff, Parishioners, and even a brief visit by our Brother, Father Luis Salazar. The inspiring videos by Dr. Brant Pitre prompted some profound discussions, insights and even some entertaining levity. Light refreshments and snacks were provided.

The series of "Lectio: Eucharist" sessions are continued for the next four Tuesdays in Lent at Saint Joseph Parish Hall at 6:30 pm until about 8:30 pm. *All local Catholics and non-Catholics adults* are invited to come and learn more about Eucharist at these fulfilling presentations.

Why do we pray?

Unfortunately, we too often see requests for prayers in eMails and in our Facebook page for our Brother Knights and their families who are facing serious illnesses and death.

But, why do we pray?

God invites us into a relationship with Him that is both personal and communal. He speaks to us through His Son, Jesus Christ, the Word-made-flesh. Prayer is our response to God who is already speaking or, better yet, revealing Himself to us. Therefore, prayer is not merely an exchange of words, but it engages the whole person in a relationship with God the Father, through the Son, and in the Holy Spirit.

The Conference of Catholic Bishops, in reminding us of the Spiritual Work of Mercy "Praying for the Living and the Dead", teaches us that prayer is one of the most powerful ways we can support others. Joining together in prayer for the living and the dead entrusts us all into God's care.

Closely related to "Praying for the Living and the Dead" is the Spiritual Work "Comforting the Sorrowful" which we can practice by

- Lending a listening ear to those going through a tough time
- Write a letter or send a card to someone who is suffering
- Consider obtaining a Mass Card from the Parish Office for the living or the deceased

A few moments of your day may make a lifetime of difference to someone who is going through a difficult time and will make a lifetime of difference in *your* life as well.


