# February Meeting Challenge

At the February Meeting, Greg Gully challenged the Knights in attendance to support life and to join Brother Wayne at the abortion mill in Jacksonville.

Sisters in Christ:

I just would like to share a story about the day Tony and Welman joined me at the mill—A Woman’s Choice of Jacksonville abortuary. While we were praying at AWC, we were joined by Francis, a fellow sidewalk advocate for 313, a Family for LIFE group. This day there didn’t seem to be to much activity, so I asked Francis to check out All Women’s Help Center, another abortion mill which is less than two miles away. That’s right - so close to each other and the third abortion mill, Planned Parenthood, located about three miles in the other direction. The “killing triangle” of Jacksonville.

## Family Life Message Wayne Friday



While Francis was at AWHC, he called and told me that there was LOTS of activity. So I asked Tony and Welman to stay at A Woman’s Choice while I went to AWHC to help Francis. While there, I got the attention of a young girl who was with her mom. It seemed to me that the mother was pointing her daughter in the direction to have an abortion. So, I told the young mom that she didn’t have to let anyone tell her what to do with her child. This young lady did enter the abortion mill BUT came back out. I told her about the WOMEN’S HELP CENTER. I told her that she was too beautiful of a person to be in such a foul place like the abortion mill. She smiled and went back in. I went across the street and texted Tony and Welman. All of a sudden, this young mom was in front of me and told me that she wanted to go to the Help Center. I called Nancy, a super lady there, and she sent an Uber to pick up the young mom and bring her to the WOMEN’S HELP CENTER. As we waited for the Uber, she told me that she and her mom had an argument and she left the abortion mill to get something to eat, That’s when she made her move to come talk to me, She is only 19. I gave her my phone number and told her she could call me if she had any problems—“I’m a pretty good problem solver.” She called me immediately so I would have her number.

The next day, I texted her, but no response. I texted again...again, no response. Then all of a sudden, she responded. Her baby is 13 weeks and she wanted to share the first picture of her baby and sent me the ultrasound photo of her baby. IT MADE MY DAY! Praise the Lord! I love Jesus and was glad that Tony, Welman, Francis and I were able to help Jesus and this young lady to see how precious life is. God bless us all! God bless the Knights of Columbus.

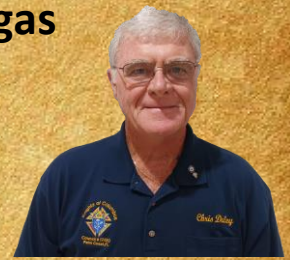

VATICAN CITY (CNS) — The nearly 400-year-old sculpted canopy towering over the main altar of St. Peter’s Basilica will be surrounded by scaffolding for most of 2024 as it is washed, repaired, and restored.

The project is expected to cost 700,000 euros (about \$766,000) and will be entirely funded by the U.S.-based Knights of Columbus, which has funded 17 other projects in collaboration with the Fabbrica di San Pietro.

**Patrick Kelly, supreme knight of the Knights of Columbus, told Catholic News Service that the decision to fund the baldachin’s restoration is an “outgrowth” of the knights’ core principles of charity and unity.** “We’re in union with the Holy See, with the successor of St. Peter, and so these kinds of projects are very much in keeping with who we are and our mission,” he said. Kelly said the baldachin project is an “iconic restoration” over the tomb of St. Peter that “is a great sign of unity in the church.”

“It’s something we can look to,” he said. “All of us can be proud of this and gratified that there is unity; it’s not all disunity.”

Standing over 30 feet tall, the baldachin, designed by Baroque master Gian Lorenzo Bernini, has stood over the tomb of St. Peter since 1634. And for all that time it has gathered dust, cracks and rust despite regular cleanings.

As a result, “we can’t not intervene” to restore the structure, said Alberto Capitanucci, the head engineer of the Fabbrica di San Pietro — the office responsible for the upkeep of the basilica. Speaking at a news conference announcing the Vatican’s restoration plans on January 11, Capitanucci said the procedure would follow that of the baldachin’s last recorded restoration in 1758, only using an independent scaffolding structure that was not previously possible to build.

Pete Digiulio was awarded the Knight of the Month award for February 2024 for his work in the kitchen.



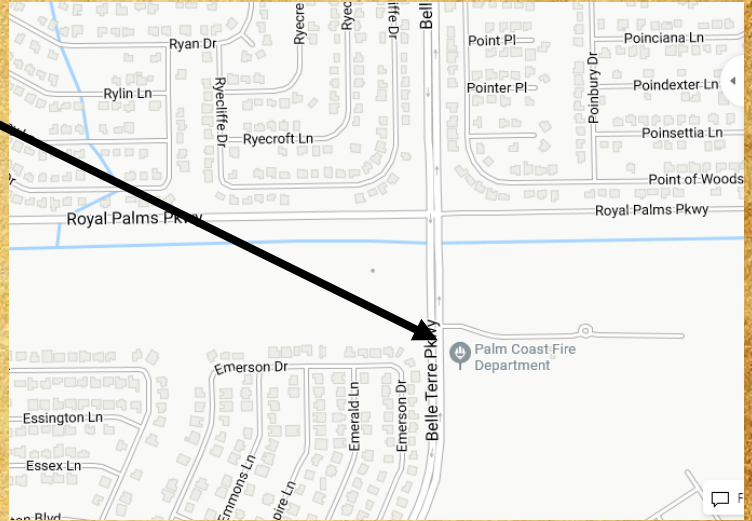

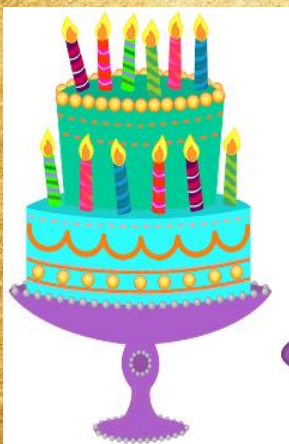

# Pumpkin Patch/Craft Fair/Food

- Last year we did the Pumpkin Patch in front of Seton Hall.
- This year we are not doing the Fall Festival, so if we do the Pumpkin Patch again we will need to get volunteers.
- Last year, our 1<sup>st</sup> year, we sold out and made around \$2,250.00 on the pumpkin patch.
- Last year we did the Craft Fair during the Fall Festival. I would like to do it this year on Saturday October 26<sup>th</sup>, 2024. If we get 60 vendors like last year each paying \$35.00 per 10'x10' spot we would make \$2,100.00. I don't need volunteers for the Craft Fair.
- If we can get volunteers the one day of the Craft Fair we could serve food (just for the one day) from 11am till 3pm. Last year we sold 5 Star Pizza. As you know we buy large pizzas (peperoni and sausage) for \$9.00 each and cheese pizzas for \$8.00. Pizzas were cut to 8 slices. We sold the for \$3.00 each or 2 for \$5.00. So we made a least \$11.00 per pizza. During the Fall Festival we sold over 100 pizzas (3 days).
- We could sell snack items like last year: cotton candy, funnel cakes, ice cream etc. Just on the one day from 11am to 3pm.



If we do what I suggest above, we could easily make over \$5,000.

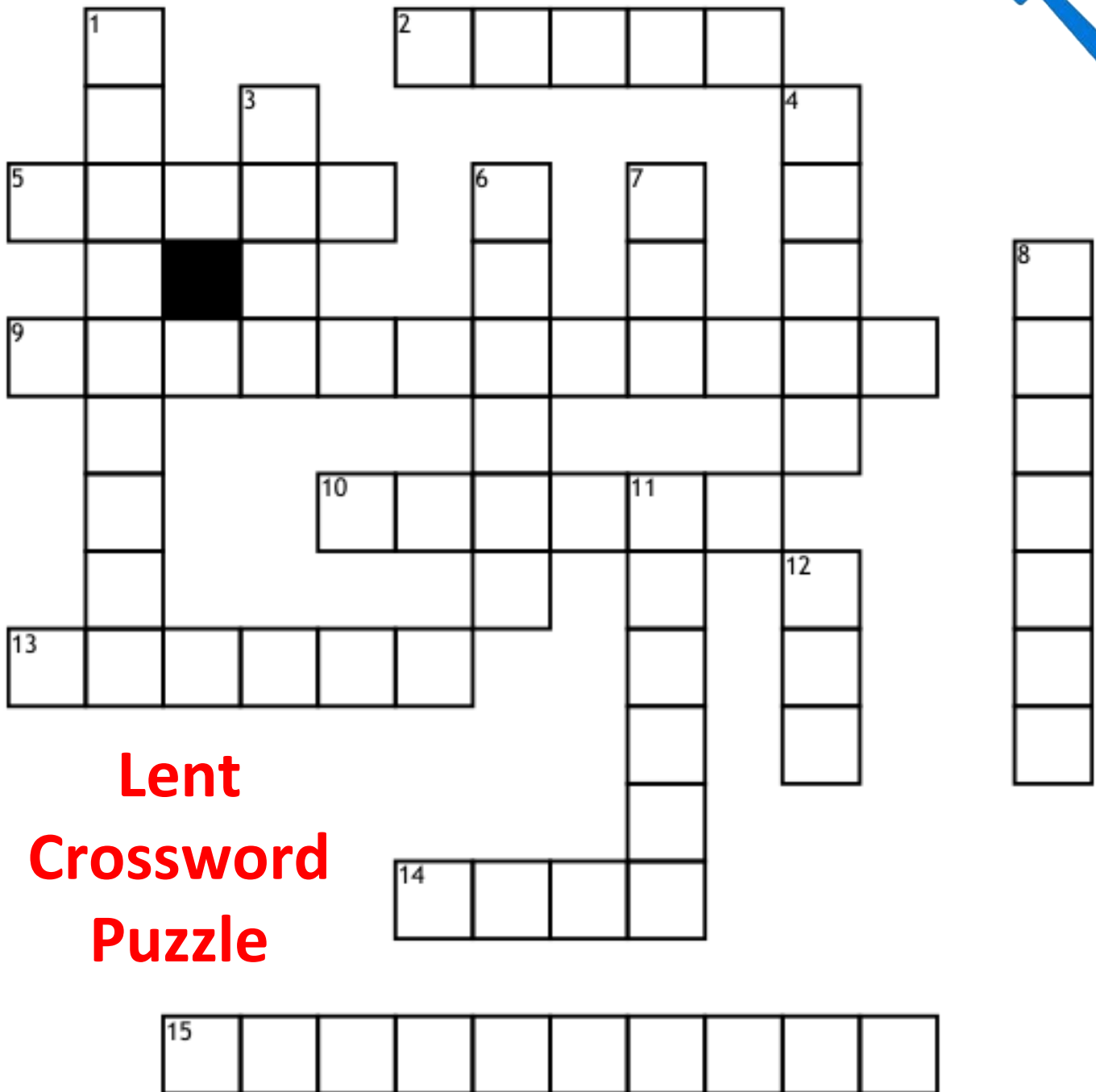

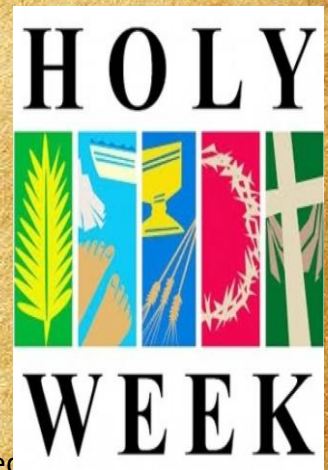

1. **THINK PRAYER.** If you have to work or go to school during Holy Week, think about how you can incorporate prayer breaks into each day.
2. **MAKE AN ADDITIONAL SACRIFICE** by fasting and abstaining from meat on Holy Thursday and Holy Saturday in addition to Good Friday.
3. **DON'T WATCH TELEVISION** from sundown on Holy Thursday until Easter morning.
4. **GO** to confession.
5. **SET ASIDE** 10 minutes every day to read Passion accounts in the Gospels.
6. Make it a point to **FORGIVE** someone on Good Friday.
7. **PRAY** the Sorrowful Mysteries of the Rosary.
8. **OFFER UP** any pain or difficulties you experience during Holy Week and unite your sufferings with the pain of Christ.
9. **PRAY** the Stations of the Cross.
10. **ATTEND** all of the Triduum liturgies.
11. **INVITE** family members, friends and neighbors — especially people who have strayed — to come to church with you.
12. **VOLUNTEER** to help decorate your parish on Holy Saturday for Easter.



### The Chrism Mass

During Holy Week bishops bless sacred oils in the diocesan cathedral at a special liturgy known as the Chrism Mass. The oil of chrim is used during baptisms, confirmation, ordination and the consecration of altars. The oil of catechumens is used at the Easter Vigil. The oil of the sick is used to anoint people during the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. The oils are then distributed to the parishes for sacramental celebrations throughout the year. As part of the liturgical reforms of Vatican II, the renewal of priestly promises was incorporated into the Chrism Mass. The Chrism Mass is an ancient celebration that traditionally takes place on Holy Thursday morning. But in recent years, many dioceses celebrate the Chrism Mass on an evening earlier in Holy Week so that more people can attend.

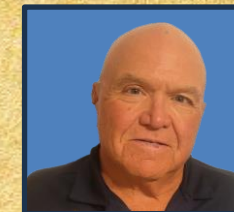

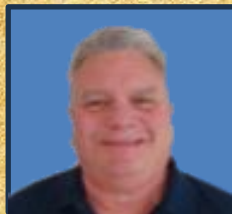
