



Next week we'll buy even more food and run all 6 friers in hopes that the crowds will come back.

Thanks to everyone who showed up last night (and this morning) to make the second fish fry the most successful fish fry ever other than the 472 meals we served when Spirit FM was here. After serving 368 meals week one, we served 399 last night. Incredible, and we could not have done it without everyone's help. The next Friday Fish Fry (March 1st) we should easily beat 400 meals - who knows, maybe we can beat 472 without Spirit FM's help.

Special thanks to Hank, who as always made sure the fryers were ready to go. Special thanks to the star of the actual fish fry, Lou Dumais - he was incredible! Lou not only makes the batter and breads the fish, but he does all of that while the fish fry is ongoing. If he wasn't there, we'd be in a lot of trouble - he thawed three boxes of fish, made more fish batter, and then did the dishes. Thank you, Lou. Thanks to Ron Merigold for keeping everyone focused and being the face of the Knights

Thanks to all the cooks, the crew in the kitchen, the runners and to all those working outside in the parking lot and taking the money. I can't say thanks enough. We had eight men become Brothers on Tuesday night and at least half of them showed up to help last night. Second, thanks to those who showed up for the cleanup crew - no one likes doing dishes (as far as I know) but we had new help in the kitchen

cleaning crew. Again, THANK YOU, THANK YOU to all the volunteers that helped. We could not do these events without your help. Let's see if we can set a new record and break the 472 meals from last year!


