## **GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE**

Brother Knights and Ladies,

As I'm sure you all know, our Council supports numerous charitable and service organizations. One area that gets a lot of our attention is support for atypical children. The Russell Home for Atypical Children provides a place to live for some of the most severely disabled in our Community. Morningstar School for Atypical Children educates functionally disabled children in both the normal courses of learning and also the basics of taking care of themselves at home and in society. Special Olympics gives atypical children and young adults the chance to excel as athletes and compete with their peers.

Until last Saturday, I was unaware of another Charity that assists our atypical population and, like Russell Home and Morningstar, is right here in Orlando. Fr. Carlos invited Marty & me to the 2022 Bishop Grady Villas Harvest Ball, and it introduced me to that Charity. It's official name is 'Magnify of Central Florida' and it's mission is to "...magnify the God-given gifts of people with disabilities." The slogan 'Some see disabilities. We see gifts' sums up their work in a nutshell.

Magnify was originally founded as a ministry by Sr. Elizabeth Marie Stoup, SSJ who spent her religious life advocating for the sacred dignity of all God's children with intellectual and developmental disabilities. She envisioned a ministry to magnify the abilities of the disabled and return to God what we have received from Him. In 2004, this ministry became Bishop Grady Villas; a residential community where adults with intellectual disabilities could live as independently as possible while receiving support to be safe and healthy. Since then, the programs have grown significantly to include Employment, Project SEARCH youth transition, and Life Skills Development programs for individuals who reside throughout Central Florida.

In 2021 the new Brand name of "Magnify of Central Florida" was adopted to reflect this expansion while continuing to honor the legacy and history of the ministry and Villas.

It primarily serves people with disabilities and their families, especially individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Secondly churches, employers, schools, and other civic and community organizations are transformed when they are ready to welcome the gifts of individuals with disabilities.

## Saint of the Month:

### ELIZABETH OF HUNGARY

Every person faces good times and bad times. We see this truth in the life of Elizabeth of Hungary. Born in 1207, Elizabeth was the daughter of King Andrew II of Hungary. She grew up a very religious child and married Ludwig, the king of Thuringia (in Germany), when she was only 14. The two worked at their marriage. They respected one another. They loved their three children.

As king, Ludwig ruled fairly. As queen, Elizabeth built two hospitals to help her people. She washed and bandaged the sores of lepers. Each day, she gave thick crusty bread—warm from the oven—to hundreds of poor people.

Then Ludwig marched off to fight in the Crusades. (The Catholic Church fought these wars to win back the Holy Land.) While away, he died of the plague. Elizabeth, who was only 20, was heartbroken.

The new king thought she had given too much of the kingdom's money to the poor, so he forced her to leave her castle and enter a convent. She had to leave her children behind.

When Ludwig's friends returned from the Crusades, they made the new king change his mind. Elizabeth got to come home to the castle and her children. Her uncle tried to force her to marry again, but she had vowed that if anything happened to her husband, she would only serve God.

She helped build a hospital and devoted herself to caring for the sick. Elizabeth wore herself out with her good works, and in 1231, at the age of only 23, she died. Money and fame had never been important to her. She treasured her husband, her children, and God. That is why the Church honors her as a saint. Because she gave so much life-giving bread to the hungry, Elizabeth is the patron saint of bakers.
