

40 Days for Life



Incarnation serves as the coordinator for 40 Days for Life 365 at the prayerful vigil at Planned Parenthood.

The January vigil would normally have been on the first Wednesday of the month. However, in 2025 that was Wednesday, January 1st, a holy day of obligation, New Years Day and a day when Planned Parenthood was closed with no abortions scheduled.

In February, the Incarnation vigil at Planned Parenthood will be on Wednesday, February 5th from 10 AM to 4 PM. Volunteers are welcome to join the Incarnation coordinator for each hour in praying for the health and welfare of the moms arriving at Planned Parenthood and their babies, and that the Planned Parenthood workers realize that life is sacred and a gift from God that should be preserved.
