He loves us without limit, and offers Himself to us in the Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. Can we not give Jesus a few minutes of love and adoration in return?







2025 SPRING TRAINING BASEBALL SEASON GETS OFF TO A GREAT START!

On Saturday, February 22nd, the Baltimore Orioles opened their 2025 Spring Training Season against the Pittsburgh Pirates. And St. Thomas Council 7826 and Incarnation Council 15332 began their 14th consecutive year jointly operating a concession stand at Ed Smith Stadium.

What an Opening Day! The weather was sunny and bright, and Ed Smith Stadium was filled with a sellout crowd of 7,628 fans. Unfortunately, the Orioles lost the game 10-5.

However, the St. Thomas More and Incarnation Councils had a great day at their Outdoor Patio Grill Concession Stand. For the fifth year, the stand sold Philly Cheesesteaks – a new item – hamburgers, cheeseburgers, hot dogs, sausage with peppers and onions, draft beer, soda, water, potato chips, cracker jacks and peanuts. And sell they did! During a four-hour period, the stand served 493 customers and generated \$13,152.75 in sales. At the end of the day, the stand earned \$1,304.86 in commissions and \$1,579.62 in tips for a total of \$2,886.48. What a great start to the 15-game schedule. Thanks to the "Team" who worked the game. They had to deal with a lot of new changes and did a GREAT JOB!!

In the last week of February, the Orioles will play the Atlanta Braves, Detroit Tigers and the Toronto Blue Jays. During March, the Orioles have game against the Pittsburgh Pirates, Boston Red Sox, Tampa Bay Rays, Minnesota Twins, Atlanta Braves, Philadelphia Phillies, Toronto Blue Jays, New York Yankees and Detroit Tigers. The season concludes on Friday night, March 21st.
