

Sarasota Medical Pregnancy Center (SMPC)





Brother Art Reilly serves as an ambassador and Committee member for Sarasota Medical Pregnancy Center in a variety of capacities. During September among other things, he

- Chaired the SMPC Board's September 22nd Medical and Educational Services Committee meeting and participated with staff and others in discussing the range of Center services, including:
- The recently delivered 26-foot mobile medical unit and updating a draft initial deployment plan to serve underserved moms at remote locations, and other local events:
- Security cameras will be added
- Deployment of unit to provide tours of the unit to neighborhood and religious communities to inform them of its capabilities and the Center's plans to serve the underserved and bridge new clients into the broader range of services offered on the Center's campus, i.e.:
- September 16 Newtown 's Janie's Garden public housing
- September 21 Tabernacle Church
- September 25 Sarasota Ministerial Association September Luncheon at the Sarasota Emergency Operations Center
- September 28 Sarasota Baptist Church
- October 4 and 5 Church of the Incarnation for its 20225 Baby Bottle Drive
- October 16 SMPC Golf and Give event

- October 18 Mama's Collard Green Festival
- Additional requests for deployment at events are being received to be scheduled as of this writing
- The November 17th Pastors Breakfast with keynote speaker, DR. William Lile, a former neurosurgeon who performed in utero surgeries. Dr. Lile will be advocating for pastors to create a welcoming environment within their churches for women facing unplanned pregnancies – offering them spiritual support and referring them to pregnancy resource centers to help with medical, parenting education and material support.
- Report on Center activities in the Newtown community of Sarasota, including the deployment of the mobile unit and activities supporting the Newtown Community Ministries United.
- The possibility of adding genetic screening to identify adverse chromosomal conditions in order to support the parents and, where possible, treat the conditions in a lifeaffirming environment.
- The significant growth of the number of new clients and their use of the ever increasing range of Center services has continued in 2025. The Committee discussed the need for additional staff and office space and indicated their support for several actions by the Board.

 Participated at the July 18th Prayer Service at the Koinonia Missionary Baptist Church held by the Newtown Community Ministries United (NCMU) where Art was given an

- opportunity on the SMPC Mobile Medical Unit that would be delivered in about one month with initial deployment expected to be in Newtown.
- Participated in the SMPC Board's Finance and Donor Committee meetings.
- Has been (or will be) the driver for the unit and one of the tour guide at all of the mobile unit event listed above.
- Will be holding mobile unit training sessions for the eight other Knights who have volunteered to drive the mobile unit
- Will be describing the initial plans for the SMPC Mobile Medical Unit and its role in better serving the community at the October meeting of the Our Lady of Angels KofC Council meeting.

Brother Art introduced SMPC CEO Jennifer Carey who expressed appreciation to Incarnation for its continuing support and invited the Parish congregation to tour the SMPC Mobile Medical unit when it is at Incarnation for the Baby Bottle Drive on October 4 and 5 and the SMPC October 23rd "A Loving Tribute - A Night of Support" at SMPC to support those who have experienced a pregnancy loss.

Jennifer Carey and Brother Art placed flowers in front of the Incarnation Monument to the Unborn. This Incarnation tradition began in 2023 inspired by a grandmother who despite the fact that she lives about 2000 miles from Sarasota reached out to inquire whether she could attend our 2023 Observation of this day to remember her grandson who had been recently aborted. She longed to honor him and Incarnation offered a place that would forever honor and remember him and the many millions of other babies who have been aborted.

NOTE: The grandmother came back to Sarasota in 2024 and again in 2025 to visit the Incarnation Memorial to the Unborn and leave an expression of her love. In September Brother Art received an email from her with a photo of her new grandson.



On November 11, 2025, Sarasota National Cemetery will be hosting the Annual Diocese of Venice Veterans Day Mass at 3 m.

First and foremost, I want to thank the Assemblies and Councils who graciously contributed to this event last year. Your contribution allowed us to thank the Veterans, past and present, who gave to our country instead of spending time with their families, allowed us to rest easy because they were protecting us, and those who lost their life.

Bishop Frank J. Dewayne has requested the Knights of Columbus to assist in organizing and sponsoring the Annual Veteran's Day Mass and Ceremonials. This opportunity touches the very heart of our Order's raison d'être – charity, unity, fratemity and patriotism. Through your leadership, efforts and financial support the Knights of Columbus Fraternal Order is positioned to continue the sponsorship for this event as we have done in past years.

The budget estimate for this event is expected to top \$16,000 and has drawn 1,000 to 1,500 veterans and their families.
