Sarasota Medical Pregnancy Center (SMPC)





Brother Art Reilly serves as an ambassador and Committee member for Sarasota Medical Pregnancy Center in a variety of capacities. During September among other things, he:

- Chaired the SMPC Board's October 20th Medical and Educational Services Committee meeting and participated with staff and others in discussing the range of Center services, including:
- The recently delivered 26-foot mobile medical unit and updating a draft initial deployment plan to serve underserved moms at remote locations, and other local events:

- Deployment of unit to provide tours of the unit to neighborhood and religious communities to inform them of its capabilities and the Center's plans to serve the underserved and bridge new clients into the broader range of services offered on the Center's campus, i.e.:
- October 4 and 5 Church of the Incarnation for its 2025 Baby Bottle Drive
- October 16 SMPC Golf and Give event
- October 18 Mama's Collard Green Festival
- October 26 Incarnation Fall Festival
- October 28 Newtown Community Health Action Team (CHAT) meeting at the Newtown Library
- November 1 In front of the new Mote SEA at UTC where registration will be held for an SMPC Fundraiser at PopStroke Golf
- November 8 St Jude's Hispanic Festival
- November 17 SMPC Pastors (and clergy)
 Breakfast with Dr William Lile at the Carlisle
 Inn
- November 17 SMPC Donor Appreciation Luncheon at the Carlisle Inn
- Additional requests for deployment at events are being received to be scheduled as of this writing.
- In addition, multiple client intakes have taken place on:

- SMPC's medical services consultant who has had significant experience with mobil medical units at several number of pregnancy centers has indicated that she has never seen a situation in which the community and clients have responded so strongly and quickly to such a unit,

- Report on Center activities in the Newtown community of Sarasota, including the deployment of the mobile unit and activities supporting the Newtown Community Ministries United.
- The plan for adding in 1Q26 genetic screening to identify adverse chromosomal conditions in order to support the parents and, where possible, treat the conditions in a life-affirming environment.
- The significant growth of the number of new clients and their use of the ever increasing range of Center services has continued in 2025.
- The Committee discussed the need for additional staff and office space and indicated their support for several actions by the Board.

Brother Art also:

- Has been (or will be) the driver for the unit and one of the tour guide at all of the mobile unit event listed above.
- Spoke at the October 16th Our Lady of Angel's KofC Council meeting at SMPC and the Mobile medical Unit. Two Knights volunteered to be a driver for the unit.
- Participated at the October 17 Prayer Service at the Trinity Church held by the Newtown Community Ministries United (NCMU) town.
- Participated in the SMPC Board's October 17th Finance meeting and October 25th Strategic Planning meeting.
- Held Training sessions for volunteer drivers for the mobile unit on October 21 and 24.
- Displayed the unit and gave tours of it at the October 26th Incarnation Fall Festival.
- Will be holding other training sessions for the four other Knights who have volunteered to drive the mobile unit.


Veterans Day





Advocate honored with Diocesan Culture of Life Award



Art Reilly, Pro-Life Coordinator at Incarnation Parish in Sarasota, and former board member of Sarasota Medical Pregnancy Center, was honored with the Diocese of Venice Culture of Life Award at the Culture of Life Conference Oct 4, 2025, in

Miami. Reilly also went above and beyond to help defeat Amendment 4, which would have radically expanded access to abortion in Florida. Among his work was speaking at multiple Catholic and non-Catholic churches to speak the truth about the amendment, as well as creating and placing yard signs, and then reposting the signs following two 2024 hurricanes.


