2026 SPRING TRAINING BASEBALL SEASON IS A SUCCESS



For the fifteenth consecutive year, St. Thomas More Council 7826 and Incarnation Council 15332 operated a concession stand at Ed Smith Stadium during the 2026 Baltimore Orioles Spring Training Baseball Season. And for the sixth season, the Councils operated the Outdoor Patio Grill Concession Stand – AND WE DID VERY WELL!!

Operational Results

The original schedule called for 17 games, but only 15 were played as there were two rainouts. For those games, Orioles drew 82,000 fans, or 6,308 per game. Our concession stand served 7,146 customers for an average of 446 per game. And what did we serve!! How about 4,389 hot dogs, 2,993 hamburgers/cheeseburgers, 1,194 sausages with peppers and onions, and 806 cheesesteaks. To wash down all that food, we sold 3,571 beers, 2,365 bottled waters, and 1,936 bottled sodas and Gatorades. The fans also bought ballpark favorites – peanuts and Cracker Jacks.

The Councils operated a successful concession stand because of the commitment, dedication and hard work of the Brothers and Sisters from St. Thomas More and Incarnation who volunteered to work the stand. Incarnation Council provided 16 volunteers – Steve Christie, Dawn Gordon, Pete Gordon, Mark and Teresa Gunzelman, Dale Haas, Bryan Hoskinson, Doug and Monica Maglich, John

Marcinek, Tom O'Loughlin, Albert Paine, Damian Ruppert, Patrick Shanahan, Chris and Traci Williams. Unfortunately, a couple of our regular volunteers could not work this year because of health and other issues. I thank very much those Brothers and Sisters who volunteered to fill those positions.

Finally, the concession stand was successful this year because of the leadership of Dale Haas. This was Dale's first year as Concession Stand Manager, and he did an outstanding job!! He worked every game and made sure everything went smoothly even when he faced challenges. And special thanks goes out to John Marcinek and Chris Williams who worked every game. Thank you for your dedication.

Financial Results

So how did we do? The Outdoor Patio Grill generated gross sales of \$189,237.00, or \$11,827.34 per game. After deducting discounts and sales tax, net sales were \$173,418.45, or \$19,838.65 per game. The Councils receive 10% of net sales, which amounted to \$17,341.83. In addition, the concession stand received \$17,978.56 in credit card tips and \$1,413.25 in cash tips for a total of \$19,391.81, or \$1,211.99 per game. The bottom line is that the concession stand generated \$36,733.64 in revenues for the two Councils.

After deducting expenses – 10% of credit card tips for commissary workers who provided supplies for the concession stand, Orioles tee shirts, Council hats, stand supplies and Thank You Party costs – each Council should receive

around \$17,000. The amount is an estimate until the final accounting and check is received from the Baltimore Orioles, which should be around mid-April.

Farewell

After 23 years, I am retiring from managing Spring Training Baseball Concession Stands at Ed Smith Stadium for Knights of Columbus Councils. For eight years, I managed Our Lady of Victory Council 3358 concession stand operations. And for the last 15 years, I have overseen the operations of four different concession stands for St. Thomas More Council 7826 and Incarnation Council 15332. It has been an honor and privilege to work with so many dedicated Brothers and Sisters over all these years. And I thank the various Council Grand Knights who gave me the annual opportunity to manage Spring Training Baseball Concession Stand Operations for the Councils. It is an experience that I will never forget.

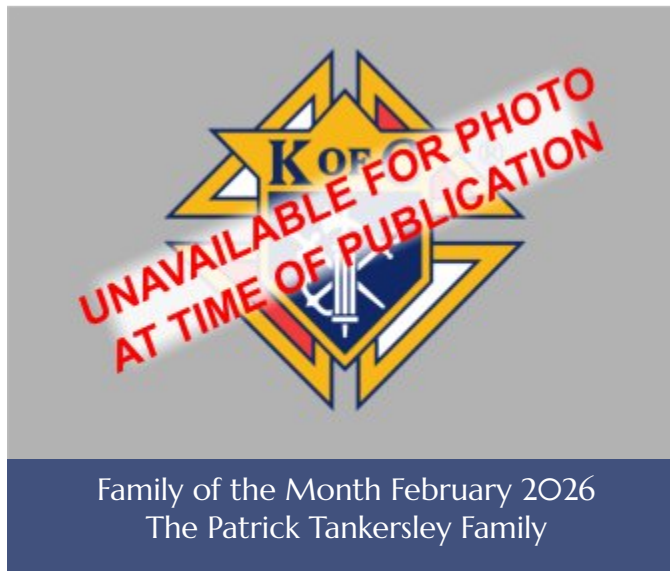

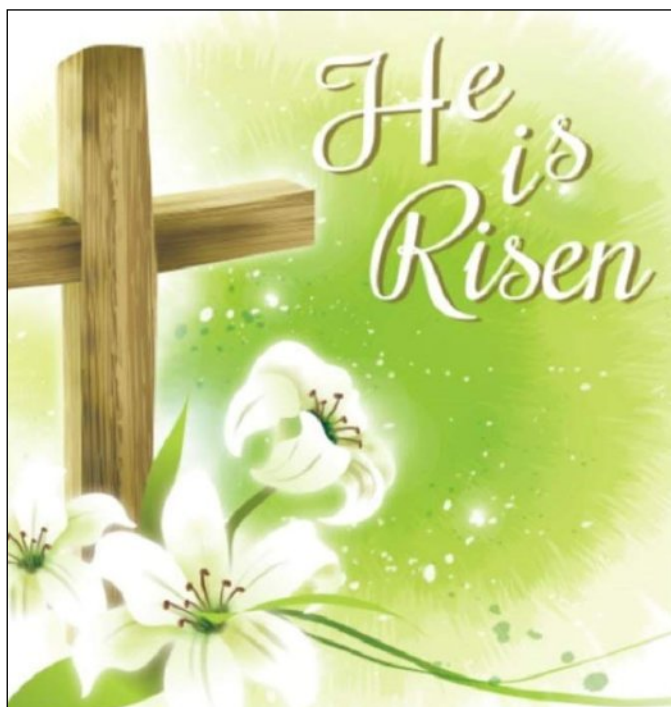
