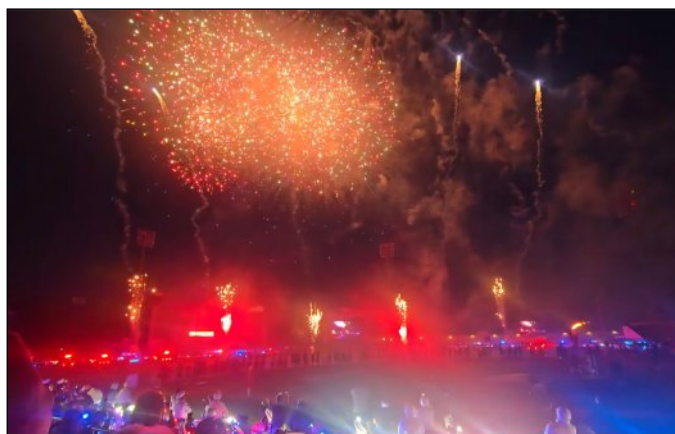
event and in his words it was “An Amazing Experience”.

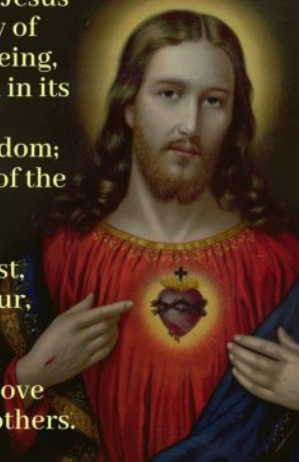
