VOTE "NO" ON 2024 FLORIDA CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT #4

Brother Art has been working with the Diocese of Venice Respect Life Directors and other prolife leaders in Southwest Florida to plan a Sarasota County program to educate the public that Constitutional Amendment 4 regarding abortion on the November 2024 Ballot in Florida is NOT WHAT IT SEEEMS, AND IS TOO EXTREME! Note: Many critically important terms in the Amendment ballot summary are undefined and as a result an abortion would be allowed in all three trimesters.

Art attended general planning meetings in Sarasota of "Vote No on 4" on May 13th, and of the Sarasota Coalition Executive Committee on May 24th.

The Incarnation Council has decided to make a \$5,000 donation to this cause. The details of making this end-of-fiscal year donations are still being worked by Brother Art given Supreme Council, Florida State Council, and IRS rules related to donations by KofC Councils which are tax-exempt organizations who can only make donations to other tax-exempt organizations under prescribed conditions.

Art is also working with retired Pastor Rod Myers who chairs the SMPC "Pastors for Life" group and co-chairs the SMPC "Champions for Life" group on how SMPC and these groups can organize events and distribute materials to educate the many local churches that support SMPC as well as other pastors, ministers and lay people in other church of multi-

denominations on Amendment 4, its deception and the implications in terms of an increase in the number of abortions, as well as its adverse impact on the health and wellbeing of women.
