A message from the Grand Knight



Worthy Brothers,

I knew a man who was extremely smart. He was a teacher for over 40 years, but he could have been anything he wanted to be. He could fix anything. In the summer months, when school was out, he worked as a mechanic. His family lived in a house that he built. After dinner every night, he would work on the family cars keeping them running. Schoolteachers didn't make a lot of money and in his time, families were bigger than most families today, and the moms didn't work. This man had the patience of a saint. After working his whole life and sacrificing for his family, right after retiring he ended up raising two of his young grandchildren who were abandoned by their mother and father. I have only told you a very little bit about this man's life. The one thing I haven't told you was this man was my father.

My father passed away on March 21,2010. I think of him every day, but this time of year is always hardest. I was with him every day the last month of his life. After his 70th birthday changes started happening to my father. In a couple of years my father went from being a brilliant man to someone who could not write his name, could not talk, could not walk and was totally dependent on my mom for everything. During those years we took him to many doctors to find out what was wrong, but every doctor was baffled. His last stay in the hospital, his main nurse was a student of his many years before. This was not unusual in my father's life to meet many former students in their adult life. The doctors at the hospital told my mother he would need to be put on a feeding tube to live. She refused and we took him home to die. This poor man basically starved to death which I had to watch over the following weeks.

If you have read this so far, I thank you for letting me share a very short version of my father's life. The reason for this story is this, I would give anything to be able to tell my father how much I loved him and how much he meant to me. I tell him now in my heart and in my prayers and I hope he can hear me. If you are fortunate enough to still have your father, tell him how you feel. If you are a father and have sons or daughters let them know how you feel about them. Let them know how much they mean to you. Give them the greatest memories of you that they can cherish long after you leave this world.

Was my dad proud of me? I don't know because he never told me. Did my father know how much I loved him? I don't know because I never told him. The biggest misconception I had in my life was that a strong man never shared his feelings or said I love you. This is one of the biggest falsehoods that I have ever known. Tomorrow isn't promised to anyone. Remember when becoming a Knight in the ceremony were the words *Tempus Fugit, Memento Mori* which means Time Flies, Remember Death. Don't make the same mistakes I made in life and don't wait till tomorrow because tomorrow might be too late.



All Knights are encouraged to attend any service as a part of your Lenten preparation for the Glory of the Resurrection.



Bob was Exemplified as a member of our Council on August 1st 2000 and took his 4th Degree Exemplification on November 24th 2001.

Bob was also very active in the 4th Degree Assembly; for several years our old Assembly (154) Father Mendoza participated in the Lakeland Christmas Parade; Bob volunteered to tow the Assembly's Ship "Santa Maria" with his pickup truck, he would take off of work to help clean the ship before the parade and if needed made the necessary repairs to the ship before the voyage of the parade route in downtown Lakeland. Bob was also very active in the Color Corp of our local 4th Degree Assembly by dressing in his regalia and attending 1st Holy Communions for the children of St. Joseph's parish and attending funerals of brother Knights from our Council as well as other Councils in Lakeland.
