

While there have been no new saves reported this month, the presence of the ultrasound machine will undoubtedly play a vital role in our community's pro-life efforts.

Our fish fry events have seen great success, with an average of 441 meals served each week—up from last year's average of 364! Thank you to all who have contributed. We are also excited to welcome three new members who have joined our Council online. Together, let's nurture their journey and keep our ranks strong.

Regarding community engagement, we raised a net profit of \$7,400 from our Golf Tournament on February 22nd—thank you to all who participated.

Holy Eucharist

The Eucharist (Holy Communion), simply is Christ's body, blood, soul, and divinity under the appearance of bread and wine. It is not a symbol of Christ, but rather, it is truly and really Jesus Christ!

At the point in the Mass known as the consecration the priest, acting in persona Christi, will say "This is my Body, which will be given up for you" and "This is my Blood...". These were the words of Our Saviour when He turned the bread and wine at the Last Supper into His Body and Blood, and, by the divine power of God in the priesthood, the bread and wine become Jesus Christ. Note: It is correct to say the Bread and wine become Jesus, not Jesus becomes bread and wine.

At the Consecration during the Mass everyone present except the celebrant should kneel in adoration because by God's divine power the bread and wine become His eternal Son, Jesus Christ (GIRM 21). The bread and wine become Jesus Christ's Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity as Our Lord Himself taught in Sacred Scripture specifically at the Last Supper. The only thing remaining of bread and wine is the appearance of bread and wine (called the "accidents").

Jesus Christ gave this awesome power to his disciples, the first bishops who have passed this down through the Sacrament of Holy Orders.



The Catechism of the Catholic Church, a collection of all Catholic beliefs produced in 1992, calls the Eucharist the "source and summit of our faith" (1324). It is in that moment when we receive the Eucharist that our soul is in ecstasy because Christ is truly in us. Jesus Christ loved us so much at the last Supper, even though He knew His death was near, He gave us the joy of being with Him eternally.

Clearly we need Jesus Christ as He is the "...only way, truth, and life", and it is in the Most Holy Eucharist that the veil between Heaven and earth is the shortest and we receive Our Lord, Most High. That intimate moment can not be put into words as it is only the soul that speaks with such fervent love that some are moved to tears. We truly are living Our Saviour's Command: "Take ye, and eat. This is my body" (Matthew 26:26).

Let Us Pray.

O Lord Jesus Christ, Who dost deign to remain with us in Thy wonderful Sacrament to the end of the world, in order to give to Thy Father, by the memory of Thy Passion, eternal glory, and to give to us the Bread of life everlasting: Grant us the grace to mourn, with a heart full of sorrow, over the injuries which Thou hast received in this adorable Mystery, and over the many sacrileges which are committed by the impious, by heretics and by bad Catholics. Inflame us with an ardent zeal to repair all these insults to which, in Thine infinite mercy, Thou hast preferred to expose Thyself rather than deprive us of Thy Presence on our altars, Who with God the Father and the Holy Spirit livest and reignest one God, world without end. *R: Amen.*

I hope you are enjoying our beautiful Spring weather...




This month, I want to start with a brief update on my health concerns.

Fish Fry Update:

The Lenten Season Friday Fish Fry is coming to a close, with four of the six now completed. With 4 Fish Frys under our belts, we have set a new record for the number of meals served in one night at 487, compared to an average of 426 so far, versus last year's average of 364 (for all 6). So far, we have used 2,099 pieces of fish and 5,188 pieces of shrimp to fill an average of 191 orders this year, compared to 164 average orders last year. This year, we added a new fryer to the cooking line, bringing the number of fryers to 6. Then, we experienced another fryer failure last week, with the repair cost being too high, so we had to purchase a new one. Even with these higher costs, it appears we will still exceed last year's earnings with two more fish fries left to go.
