



Say NO to Amendment 4

Statistics show that only 50% of Catholics have registered to vote and only 50% of these voters come out to vote.

It is critical that more Catholics and non-Catholics alike register and vote, particularly to reject Amendment 4, which will effectively remove all constraints on abortion in Florida.

Amendment 4 is a proposed Amendment to our Florida Constitution that would enshrine abortion as a constitutional right. - Inform yourself review materials available on various websites https://www.flaceb.org/abortion-amendment (Florida Council of Catholic Bishops)


