

The most wonderful time of the year -- and the busiest!

At the time of this writing I am preparing for -- by far -- the busiest time of the entire year for any priest, Advent (for various reasons, it's not Lent). This year, Advent is crammed into a three-week period; the fourth Sunday of Advent also falls on December 24. Both the fourth Sunday and Christmas are Days of Obligation. Going to just one doesn't count for both!

Historically, Advent also has been the busiest time for Council 4955. In addition to all of its other recurring events and meetings, they hosted *many separate* "Christmas" celebrations every year, all crammed-in before Christmas Eve:

- Pinehurst Nursing (now "Seaview") in Pompano Beach
- Tree-lighting Ceremony with Caroling
- Council 4955 3rd Degree
- Council 4955 Ladies' Auxiliary
- Assembly 1534 4th Degree
- Council 4955 Children's Party
- Several corporate "holiday" banquet rentals (paid the bills!)

Although virtually all of these, year after year, are forever among my happiest memories, the most profound and frequent experience for me is the Children's Christmas party.

My participation began nearly 40 years ago, and I couldn't have been more mesmerized by these first impressions of the KofC. Yes, it was exciting that Santa took time from his busy schedule to be with us, but these events had the more exciting consequence of introducing me to many of the other works of the Council. I couldn't help but notice their promotions on the walls advertising "Keep Christ in Christmas" and other events, as well as their several dozen accolades earned by that point.

Because I realize that December, in numerous ways, is the busiest month for everyone, I wanted to offer this gentle reminder of the "Reason for the Season."

Columbiettes auxiliary is off to a busy new year

Sister Columbiettes have been very busy beginning with a raffle at the July 27th wine taste.

First, in July the auxiliary donated backpacks and school supplies for Broward County underprivileged students.

Second, in August, we partnered with K of C Assembly 1534 to collecting new and used Bibles for their prison ministry. We collected Bibles from three parishes for a total of over 500 new and used Bibles and cash donations totaling \$467.

Third, September 9th, four officers attended the state regional meeting in Winter Haven. While there, we accepted our Margaret Mary J. Mangan Achievement award plaque.

Fourth, September 16th both Columbiettes and Knights participated in the Rick Case Habitat for Humanity house building project.

September 16th, we partnered with the Knights Council 4955 to put on the San Gennaro Festival. We sold tickets, decorated the hall, and helped serve and clean up.
