

A message from the Grand Knight







Worthy Brothers,

I have heard on various television shows about mental health. I thought it was mental health month and I had to look up when mental health month was on the internet. I found out it was not until May. Then I had to ask myself why there was so much attention to mental health? Then I turned on the television one night to see the mass shooting in Maine. What happened to this man who served in the military for 20 years to make him do such a horrific thing?

My son works for the V.A. in Los Angeles. He had told me that almost every day in the parking lot where he worked a veteran committed suicide. How tragic to think that people can feel so badly about themselves that the only way out of their situation is to end their lives. Healthy minded people cannot comprehend this. Understanding this state of mind is nearly impossible for the average person. In 2021 there were over 48,000 suicides in the United States. Depression is the leading cause of suicide.

Hopefully none of my brothers ever get to a point of depression, desperation or hopelessness which changes how you view yourselves. This short message is directed at any Knight who may be at this point. Please get some help. Talk to someone. Sometimes it is a chemical imbalance which you have no control of. Everyone goes through days where they feel down or depressed. Usually a person can come out of this feeling in a few days.

It is when this feeling continues for weeks or months and gets worse is when you are in trouble. If you get to this point then things get even more difficult. Try to get an appointment to see a mental health specialist. This could take months to get an appointment. Your regular physician is usually no help in this area. Urgent care cannot help you. Your health department cannot help you. All these people will tell you to check yourself into the hospital. Once people have gotten to this point I am sure you can understand why they can see no hope for themselves. If you have a friend or loved one who tries to talk about their problems, please listen. Try and help them get help. Don't judge them.

There was a great commercial on a few months ago about someone opening up to a friend about their depression and the responses were: It will pass, keep your mind busy, find a hobby, get more sleep, or you're working too hard. None of these responses would help someone who is severely depressed. You may be the only, or last, person that someone suffering from depression may talk to. Please don't take this lightly. You may be this person's only chance from doing something terrible.





Knight in Need Special Request

We recently heard from our brother Nicholas Shirley regarding his request for support in raising a large amount of funds to help him recover from longstanding PTSD. Nick had been an active member of our Council, regularly volunteering to host Bingo, to participate in recruiting, and in cooking for the homeless.

His current circumstance finds him practically unable to continue his studies in Counseling and Clinical Mental Health and pursuing his therapist license due to the stress involved with his work as an EMT.

We posted the following on our Facebook page and reached out to other parish service and prayer organizations for their support and individual member consideration.

We recently heard from a long time Brother, Nicholas Shirley, who is suffering from PTSD from his work serving others as an EMT. In Nick's own words:

Working with a therapist, and the challenges of PTSD for nearly 10 years, it was suggested I look into a service dog to help me in every day tasks and to live a more fulfilling life. The challenge now, is that the cost of a service dog at a minimum is approximately \$15,000 This is a huge ask, and the consideration is greatly appreciated.


