

SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

NOVEMBER 2025

"You will be hated by all because of my name, but not a hair on your head will be destroyed. By your perseverance you will secure your lives." (Gospel for Nov. 16, Lk 21:17-19)

Jesus promised his faithful disciples many things — that he will always be with us, that we will receive if we ask, and that he would give us rest. He also promised that we would be hated and that we would be persecuted for the sake of his name. We must persevere and remain faithful despite the hardships we suffer for our faith. May we always put into action St. Paul's admonition: "Rejoice in hope, endure in affliction, persevere in prayer" (Rom 12:12).



Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to learn more about the lives of the saints by selecting one or more martyrs to read about and then reflecting on how you can imitate his or her perseverance and hope.

Questions for Reflection:

Have you ever struggled with hope when life has brought challenges? Have you ever experienced bigotry, rejection, hostility or hatred on account of your Catholic faith? What are some concrete ways you can seek to grow in perseverance to face life's difficulties?

Tuesday, September 30th, 2025 at 4PM

The box, located at 1250 Belle Terre Parkway, offers a safe, secure, and anonymous alternative for parents in crisis to legally surrender an infant. It represents a significant step forward in the local mission to ensure every baby has a chance for a safe and loving future.

This new location adds to the growing network, making it the 11th Safe Haven Baby Box in Florida and one of 384 locations nationwide.

The event featured several speakers and a blessing:

Speakers included Monica Kelsey, Founder of Safe Haven Baby Boxes; Bryant Perszyk, Grand Knight, Knights of Columbus; Kyle Berryhill, Palm Coast Fire Chief; and Charles Gambaro, Palm Coast City Council.






