<u>Habitat</u>

On Thursday, September 21st, 2023, 10 Knights of Council #13341, along with two (2) spouses, teamed together with Habitat for Humanity at the Habitat Depot in Palmetto to assist with preparing, organizing, and storing building materials for future use in the new construction of 16 single family homes at Polling Gardens.

The project team completed the following tasks:

- Received fifty-six (56) bundles of wall construction building blocks.
- Off-loaded all bundles from tractor trailer. Bundles stacked and placed on pallets and subsequently stored in the front parking lot of the Habitat Depot.
- A large tarp was placed over the top of the palleted materials and tied down to protect from damage from the elements.







Catechism Corner Gifts of the Holy Spirit

In addition to the infused Theological and Moral Virtues, God gives the *Gifts of the Holy Spirit* to our souls through the Sacrament of Confirmation. These Gifts are as follows:

Wisdom
Understanding
Counsel
Fortitude
Knowledge
Piety
Fear of the Lord

They are permanent endowments of the soul in the State of Grace – supernatural habits (different from virtues) that enable us to instinctively comply with the inspirations of the Holy Spirit. They differ from the Infused Virtues in that under the influence of these Gifts we "passively" comply, whereas under the influence of Infused Virtues we "actively" perform good actions consistent with our ultimate goal. The operative descriptions for actions performed under the influence of the Gifts of the Holy Spirit are "instinctive and instantaneous" – as in *inspired*.

Wisdom helps us to recognize the importance of others, while keeping God central in our lives. It helps us to properly order our relationship to the world, loving Creation for the sake of God, and not for its own sake.

Understanding is the ability to comprehend the meanings of God's messages – the essence of the truths of our Faith.

Counsel is the ability to determine (almost by intuition) the optimum way to follow God's plan, when we have choices that relate to Him.

Fortitude is the courage to do what one knows to be moral and right, regardless of oppositional consequences.

Knowledge is the ability to contemplate and explore God's Revelation (Scripture and Tradition), and to recognize that there are mysteries of Faith beyond us.

Piety implies the willingness to worship and serve God – beyond a sense of duty, and out of love for Him.

Fear of the Lord gives us the desire to avoid offending God, while harboring the certainty that He will give us the grace that we need in order to keep from offending Him. This Gift arises from love of God.

Everybody in the State of Grace is blessed with these Gifts. However, not all are equally led by them. Personal prayer and charity are needed to make us more receptive and compliant.
