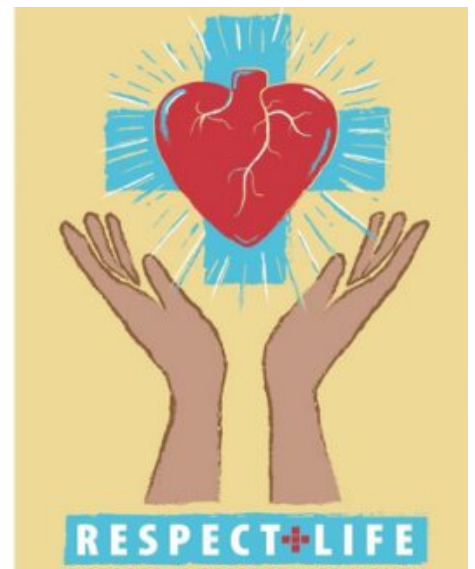

Catholic Social Teaching is sometimes referred to as the Catholic Church's "best kept secret" because few know of our rich treasury of teachings regarding the respect for the human person, promotion of the family, preferential option for the poor, the common good, subsidiarity, dignity of work, and pursuit of peace and justice. And fewer yet, embrace it all. Our Social Justice doctrine originates in Genesis and the fact that we are created by God in His image, with an innate and inalienable dignity and worth. Gifted with free will, we are called to respect and respect all life, especially our brothers and sisters who are most vulnerable. While some may want to emphasize one right over all others or one group of people over others, the fact is that all life matters ... from the child in the womb, to the elderly person who is unwanted, to the person living with disabilities, to the criminal on death row, to the immigrant on our borders. All life matters from the moment of conception to natural death. This teaching brings to fruition the words of Jesus: "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of Mine, you did for Me" (Mt 25:40).

Sometimes this is easier said than done. Our Holy Father recently spoke about these challenges during his flight home from his mission to Indonesia. It is both a right and a grave responsibility to vote. It is not the place of the Church to tell people how to vote but we must inform people of the moral issues which influence our choices. As the Holy Father reminded us, it is our responsibility to make a choice even if it is for "the lesser of two evils." As Knights, and especially for those who are Fourth Degree Knights, we should do all we can to encourage others to vote and to make the best decisions possible. I encourage you to volunteer as poll workers and if possible, consider running in future elections. I hope we can all agree we need the best to run for office!

This month our parish is sponsoring a number of activities ... a decade of the rosary before each Mass in October, Respect Life Sunday (10/6), Knights Respect Life Memorial Service (after the 11:30am Mass 10/6), America Needs Fatima (noon 10/12), and the 40 Days for Life (8-14 10/25, 11/1 or every day up to 11/3 in front of the CVS on Tarpon Ave and US 19). Be informed. Be involved. Be pro-active. Be positive. Be life-giving!

Also, please pray for all those who aspire to public office as well as for those of us who are going to the polls. May we be filled with the wisdom of the Holy Spirit!

2024 Florida ballot proposal: Amendment to Limit Government Interference with Abortion

LAW CHANGES:

- NO MORE time limits on abortions.
- NO MORE requirements that abortions be performed only by medical doctors.
- NO MORE parental consent for minors to have abortions.
- NO MORE safety requirements for abortion clinics.
- NO MORE medical informed consent.
- NO MORE 24-hour waiting period.
- NO MORE laws to regulate abortion at all.

CONSEQUENCES:

- Partial-birth and up-to-birth abortions would be LEGAL.
- ANY "health care provider" could perform abortions WITHOUT BEING A MEDICAL DOCTOR.
- Minors could get abortions WITHOUT A PARENT'S CONSENT.
- Injuries or death from botched abortions would increase.
- Women would have abortions WITHOUT KNOWING THE RISKS.
- More women would have abortions UNDER PRESSURE.
- Abortions performed ANY TIME, ANY PLACE, BY ANYONE!
