

Update Your Beneficiaries

Sometimes it is easy to overlook the simplest of things.

Take, for example, the beneficiaries on your life insurance policies.

If your policy was applied for and issued several years ago, it may very well be that the person you originally selected as the beneficiary is no longer the person you would want to receive the policy proceeds. If you bought the policy when you were single, for example, you may have named your parents as beneficiaries. If you have since married, your policies should be updated to reflect your spouse as beneficiary. Maybe you've had children since, who are not named on the policies.

Most people list a primary beneficiary, who is specifically designated as the first in priority to receive policy proceeds. We also encourage the naming of a contingent beneficiary, an alternate person designated to receive policy proceeds, usually in the event that the original beneficiary pre-deceases the insured.

I routinely call all of my policyholders for annual review appointments, usually near the anniversary date of your policy – that is, the date it was originally issued. One of the matters that I'll discuss during this review is the status of your beneficiary designations. If they need updating, and they often do, I can complete the paperwork during that appointment.

I look forward to meeting with each of you to discuss your family's needs.

Journey to the Philippines

Supreme Officers pay tribute to the faithful witness and charitable work of Filipino Knights

In late August, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly and Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori made their inaugural visit to the Philippines, where they met with the country's K of C leaders, prayed at several of its holiest sites, and witnessed the evangelizing charity of Filipino Knights.

The Knights of Columbus has been present in the Philippines since 1905, and its four K of C jurisdictions — Luzon North, Luzon South, Visayas and Mindanao — have seen rapid growth in recent years. There are now more than a half million Knights in nearly 4,000 councils nationwide.

The Supreme Council delegation, which included Supreme Master Michael McCusker and his wife and the supreme knight's family, traveled throughout Manila and several surrounding cities before a final stop in Visayas. Along the way, they were able to visit numerous charitable initiatives supported by the Order. Speaking to a national gathering Aug. 24, the supreme knight commended the Filipino Knights for both their tremendous growth and their wholehearted efforts to live out the mission of Blessed Michael McGivney.

"When we launch a new program, you're always the first to embrace it. And when it comes to charity, you demonstrate a profoundly moving care for the poor and vulnerable. I saw that firsthand this week," he said. "Throughout the Philippines, councils are caring for their neighbors in many ways. ... Filipino Knights are an example of leadership for the rest of the Order."



The Many Ways Fathers Teach Their Children About Values Story by Kevin Zoromski, Michigan State University Extension

Fathers have to be more in tune with their relationships, including relationships with their family, friends, and even with themselves. Children will watch their fathers interact with others, especially how their fathers interact with other children.

It is a father's job to make sure he represents the values, and interactions, expected of his children while modeling them appropriately.

It is immensely important for fathers to show others kindness and respect and to do so in the presence of their own children, so they may learn these values directly.

Teaching Self-Confidence

Fathers can help their children feel self-confident by using positive praise and

encouragement. Positive praise and encouragement are great ways to connect with a child and help them feel good about themselves.

Use positive praise not only when your child does something good, but also when they do something that is typically expected. We often forget to give children praise and encouragement when they behave appropriately on a routine basis.

Make sure they know when you are noticing them behaving appropriately at home and especially in social situations. Be very aware to not over-use positive praise, as a child should not learn to expect praise for every little thing they do. However, make sure you are using praise and encouragement consciously more

than any correcting comments you may be making towards their behavior.

Teaching Resilience

Using positive praise and encouragement also leads to a child developing resiliency. In essence, resiliency is the ability to bounce back from a challenging or stressful situation. Whenever a father encourages a child to try their best, and to try multiple options to reach a solution, they are instilling resiliency. Giving a child the chance to come to solutions and decisions on their own builds self-confidence and self-esteem and helps them learn skills to deal with challenges that will show up in the future. As fathers use praise and encouragement to recognize their child's decision-making and choices to solve problems, they are helping them gain a feeling of importance and belonging in the world around them.

Teaching Respect and Kindness

Respect and kindness are values that are taught and reinforced by fathers who exhibit these traits toward others in their child's presence. Children learn how to interact with others by closely watching those around them. Fathers are no exception to the importance of being positive role models and need to take special care to consciously show kindness to others. Show respect and kindness not only to friends and family, but also to others in the community. Children will often imitate what they see, so it is very important for them to have fathers and role models that exhibit the qualities of respect towards others.

Teaching children about faith involves various aspects, such as reading and studying the Bible together, praying as a family, attending church services, and engaging in discussions about spiritual matters. It also entails nurturing a personal relationship with God and encouraging children to develop their own relationship with Him.



Blessed Father McGivney Children's Book - A Father's Heart CI-FATHER-BOOK \$15.00 USD The story of Blessed Michael McGivney, founder of the Knights of Columbus

Young readers and families devoted to the faith will love this beautifully illustrated graphic novel on the life and legacy of Father Michael J. McGivney, an American Blessed and founder of the Knights of Columbus. The book tells a page-turning story, from his parents' flight from Ireland's 19th century Great Hunger, to their settlement in a factory city in Connecticut, to the hardships and early death faced by newcomers to the nation, to how their oldest of 13 children grew into a holy young man and a priest who became one of the most accomplished and consequential figures in U.S. Catholicism. As a young priest serving a large immigrant population, he responded to the needs of his people by founding what today is the world's largest Catholic fraternal service organization, all the while exercising his ministry with heroic virtue and steadfast love toward the poorest and most neglected of society. Possessing both a tender heart and an indomitable will,

Father McGivney blazed a trail of acceptance and achievement for Catholics in America and was a beloved witness to the faith at a time when the Church was suspect and maligned by Protestant elites. But this book is more than simply a historical account. Through colorful, eye-catching pictures and appealing storytelling that keeps the reader engaged and informed, A Father's Heart also tells of the miraculous healing of an unborn child that led to the beatification of Blessed Michael McGivney. The healing goes to the heart of the Catholic faith, in which a large Tennessee family, trusting in God's healing power through the intercession of Father McGivney, experienced the signal favor in the birth of their healthy child in 2015. It is a story that captures the hearts and minds of young people today and serves as a testament that God is still working in our lives
