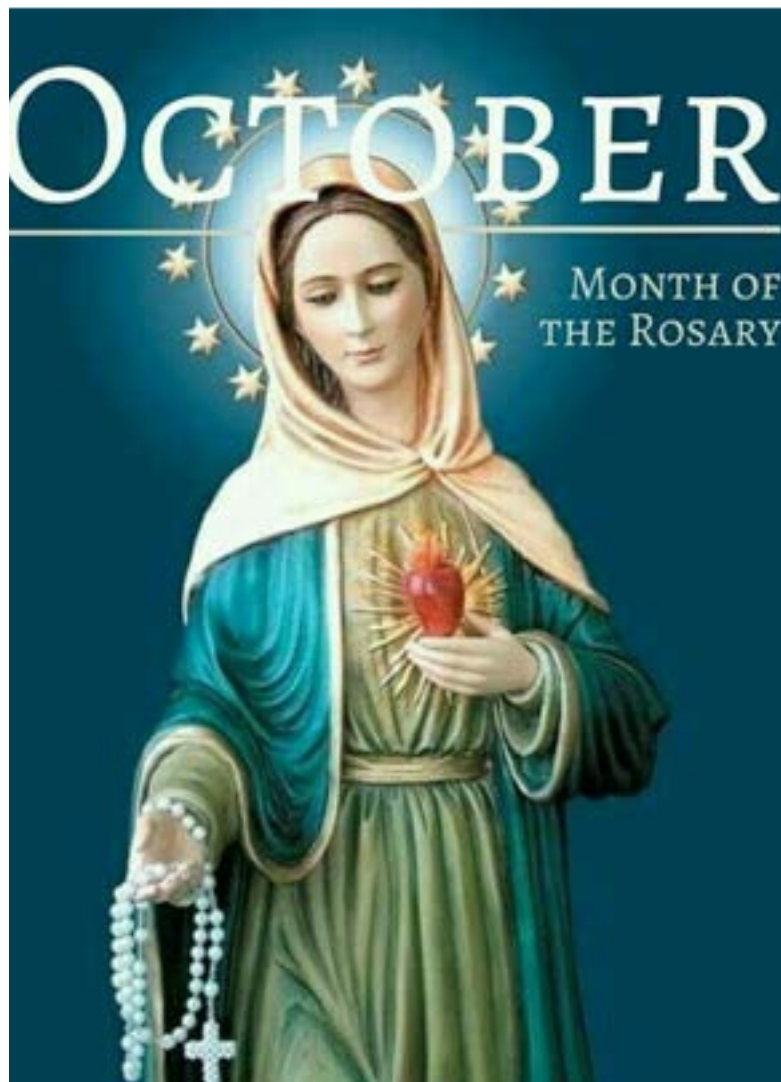

## Grand Knights Report

**HOLY ROSARY MONTH** - October is the Month dedicated to the Holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary. Remembering the mysteries of Christ's life and Our Lady's life.

There is a historical reason why October is the month dedicated to Our Lady of the Holy Rosary. In the 16th century the Islamic Ottoman Empire presented a serious military threat to southern Europe. Pope Pius V recognized the grave danger and organized the fleet called the Holy League to confront the navy of the Ottoman Turks. On October 7, 1571 the two navies, Christian navy on one side and the Ottoman navy on the other, were ready with 400 warships. The fate of western Europe depended upon the success of the Christians in this battle. Pope Pius V knew that the Christians needed more power than the military strength. Hence, he asked the faithful to pray the Rosary, seeking the intercession of the Blessed Mother. At the end of the battle of Lepanto, the Holy League of the Christians was victorious. The next year Pope Pius V established a feast in honor of the Blessed Mother on October 7th.



**RESPECT FOR LIFE MONTH** - This month is dedicated to Respect for Life by Supreme and the K of C worldwide. Beyond celebrating the Feast of the Holy Rosary on October 7th, we will be distributing “Baby Bottles” to the parishioners after all the Masses this month. We hope the Baby Bottle will be filled with money as a gentle reminder that we are committed to the rights of the unborn child. The funds donated during the month-long campaign will support the Community Pregnancy Center in downtown Sarasota.

**Golf Committee Update** - The 3rd Annual Golf Outing is scheduled on Monday, May 6th 2024 at Legacy Golf Club at Lakewood Ranch.

The Golf Committee met on September 21st. We are now in the process of “gearing up” for the event. Ralph Neller and Ken Berberich will be meeting with Legacy Golf Club on October 4th as to finalize the outing and work through several issues as to improve the event.

Last year, our Council netted nearly \$12.5k from the event. Our “secret sauce” are our major donors, our hole sponsors, and the work done by our members and volunteers on goodie bag items, auction and gift baskets for sale, 50/50, mulligan sales et al as to make the event worthwhile for all involved. Thank you! to the 30+- volunteers at the event and for our outstanding Golf Committee members as include, Ken Berberich (Chair), Ralph Neller, Joe Tiffany, Charlie Culkin, Chris Pariseau, Max Streibel, Corey DeVito, Gary Ellis, Richard Lamb, Kevin Maguire, Rob Carver, Ed Plankey, Tom Maniuszko, John Malloy and Kevin Deady.

We anticipate another year of minimum 25 foursomes or 100 golfers. Teams have been kept current on the 2024 event and we expect most teams to return, save those with health issues or unable to play and we currently have interest from 2-3 new teams, as well.



One of our goals, this year, is to increase our hole sponsors from 55, last year, to 75 this year. Our hole sponsors pay \$100 and have a sign on the course as to recognize their support of the event. Perhaps, several additional Knights, reading this, will consider being a hole sponsor, for yourself, your family, a business or “in memory of”.

We currently have six (6) major donors that support the event with either a \$500 level donation or \$1000 donation, with the latter entitling the sponsor to a 4some. All are recognized with a large – welcoming sign and recognition at the start of the outing by Fr Gordon, Legacy GC and the Golf Chair. It would be “nice” to increase our major sponsors this year, to perhaps 8 or so major sponsors. Perhaps, the Knights reading this, know of a family or business that would like to support our event as a major sponsor?

We are in need of all Brother Knights to support the event, with your positive thoughts and prayers and we are in need of goodie bag items, gift certificates and donated high-end items for the auction and gift baskets. Further, we need donated items for the goodie bags – for the 100 golfers.

I will be reaching out to the Golf Teams in November and the Volunteers, in 2024, as we get closer to the event.

We have begun collecting monies from the sponsors and will continue to do so from all the supporters of the event as we “like” to have all our funds in by January – February, well before the May outing.

We will continue to update our Brother Knights as to the status of the event, and please seek out a member of the Golf Committee if you have any questions or would like to support the event.

Lastly, the Fall 40 Days for Life Vigil (<https://www.40daysforlife.com/en/sarasota>) will be underway from Wednesday, September 27th thru November 5th, the largest 40 Days for Life campaign ever with 681 cities having vigils! For the 6th consecutive year, our STM Parish and Knights team will gather to peacefully to pray (in one hour increments) between the hours of 7AM – 7PM on Thursday, October 26th outside of Sarasota's Regional Planned Parenthood. We have been recognized in the Diocese as one of the most dedicated Knights groups to faithfully do this.
