5 Knights, 3 Wives, and 3 Culture of Life members participated as volunteers in the annual Special Olympics Stand Up Paddle State Championships at Benderson Park in Sarasota FL Saturday August 19th, 2023. The Knights had committed to 23 volunteer slots for the two-day event. However, Friday's event was cancelled due to the heat index.

The following tasks were assigned to volunteers:

Assist as needed with timing and staging of the athletes. Assist as needed with finalist athletes and distribution of awards.

Assist as needed with lunch and breakdown.

150+ athletes competed at various levels. Parents were in attendance assisting their athletes with preparation and cheering them on along with the volunteers during the races.









Habitat New Beginnings

On Thursday, July 6th, 2023, 7 Knights of Council #13341 teamed together with Habitat for Humanity at the Habitat Depot in Palmetto to assist with preparing, organizing, and storing building materials for future use in the new construction of 16 single family homes at Polling Gardens.

The project team completed the following tasks:

Set up drop cloths and all painting equipment in the front parking lot of the Depot.

Wiped down and cleaned 30-16' long pieces of baseboard molding. Applied two (2) coats of primer paint to all baseboard molding.

Stacked painted baseboard molding pieces on drying racks inside the Depot.

Washed and cleaned all paint tools and equipment and stored same inside the Depot.

Set up router table in the front parking lot of the Depot.

Prepared 12- 10' Hardy corner siding pieces. All pieces required three passes, each pass at a different depth, through router to achieve required results.

Stored all siding pieces on shelving inside the Depot.

Cleaned router table and parking lot of all debris. Router table stored inside the Depot.

IT WAS HOT OUTSIDE!

The heat may have played a role in the less than expected turn out.

But, on the positive side, we had 8 donors offer to donate palettes. This is a critical need for especially cancer and orthopedic surgery patients.

The Knights of Columbus Council 13341 in association with OneBlood held a blood drive at Our Lady of Angels Catholic Church on Thursday, July 13, 2023 from 12noon - 6pm.

We had 31 donors participating and providing 28 pints of blood to serve our local community. OneBlood had two whole blood buses and one palettes bus. I have asked that the palettes bus come more consistently so that our donors can count on it being there.

Each donation can save up to three lives, so that means 84 patients could benefit from the lifesaving efforts of our blood donors.

There was rush of donors at the beginning of the event and then steady until about 4:00pm when the donor activity dropped to about zero. The longest wait time was less than 5 minutes. We handled each donor as they arrived.

We had several deferrals which were generally caused by a low iron count. We missed out on several pints of blood. Just prior to the next event, we should send out reminders (email) about ways to increase the iron count.

This event is held 6 times per year. Solicitations were done through the church bulletin (3 Sundays in a row), a poster in the church Narthex the Sunday just prior to the drive and through emails to Brother Knights and prior donors. Appointments were booked by the donors online. Walk-ups were accommodated. Greeting, sign-in and escort to the buses were provided by 8 Knights on the day of the drive (30 total hours).



I was watching television the other day and saw an advertisement with the theme "Shop Local." The ad touted the many benefits of putting your dollars to work with businesses that are owned and operated by those folks who live and work right in your community. In addition to supporting the local neighborhood and community, the ad pointed to the personal service and the unique products one can find locally. Big box stores are great, they are convenient and provide goods at competitive prices. But many products are uniform; you can get the same thing at many other places. Their service is sometimes wanting; I can remember wandering in a big box retailer looking for help. However, when I shop at some of my favorite local spots, I always get a genuine greeting, personal help and the feeling that they really appreciate me being there and supporting them.



All this got me thinking about our local councils. The Order is doing great things in countries far and wide. We have big ideas, big plans...and they are important and have tremendous impact on making our world better. But on a local level you members are the face of the Knights of Columbus. When our local Catholic community thinks of the Knights of Columbus, I'm sure it is you members who come to mind. Our Catholic community sees all the good works you do locally. They see you volunteering to help at parish events, supporting your pastor in his needs. Local folks see you handing out coats for kids, holding fundraisers to help local families, taking the lead at sacramental events, visiting the homebound. When you lead with faith, protect your family, serve others and defend your values, you are a witness inspired by our founding principles.

Lecture

Intellectual and Moral Virtues

The pagan philosopher, Aristotle, described virtue as that which makes a man good and his works good. A contemporary definition is that (natural) virtues are good habits, which perfect our powers of action and bring them to a high peak of efficiency (Charles Sheedy, CSC, STD). Some virtues are resident in, and identified with, the intellect, while others are associated with will and emotions. There are *Intellectual* and *Moral* or *Cardinal* virtues.

Intellectual Virtues.

There are five Intellectual virtues. Three are *Speculative*, and two are *Practical*. The Speculative ones include the *Habit of First Principles, Science*, and *Wisdom*; the Practical ones are called *Art* and *Prudence*. Their discussion is outside the scope of *Catechism Corner*.

Moral or Cardinal Virtues.

Moral virtues are habits of acting according to right reason, moral law and (formed and informed) conscience. There are four Moral Virtues:

Prudence Justice Temperance Fortitude

(Note that Prudence is both an Intellectual and Moral virtue.)

Prudence is a guide that directs all other virtues because it is not only a matter of good judgment, but also because it considers actions as either good or bad. It affects our entire moral life. *Justice* motivates us to be fair and evenhanded with our neighbor – and so, it regulates our attitudes toward other people. It is truly a virtue of the will.

Temperance moves us to be reasonable in our use of sensual pleasures, especially that of eating, drinking and sexual activity. Finally, *fortitude* is synonymous with courage, as it helps us to overcome fear to do what is right – even in the face of severe adversity or consequence. *Temperance* and *fortitude* control our so-called inner life – our desires; they are the virtues brought to bear on our sense appetites, our emotions and our passions.

Intellectual and Moral virtues are acquired and lost similarly to other habits – by repetition, or non-use or contradictory actions. These are *natural virtues*, open to earnest acquisition by all intellectually honest men who wish to *do good and avoid evil*.

The exercise of Moral Virtues is necessary, but insufficient, for men to reach our final goal of the Beatific Vision in heaven. Accordingly, God has availed to mankind, an extraordinary set of instruments to help us reach our eternal destiny: *Grace, Supernatural (infused) Virtues*, and the *Gifts of the Holy Spirit*. They will be discussed in subsequent *Catechism Corner* articles.
