
Prayer for the Canonization of Blessed Michael J. McGivney

When you approach a priest for confession, are you fully cognizant that the absolution you receive through the priest comes from Christ himself? When you approach holy Communion, do you recognize and contemplate Jesus' real presence in the Eucharist you receive?




