

SAINT JOHN PAUL II NATIONAL SHRINE TO HOST EXHIBIT ON THE SHROUD OF TURIN DURING LENT



Beginning on March 5, the first day of Lent, and running through Easter Sunday, April 20, the Saint John Paul II National Shrine in Washington, D.C., will host an exhibit called "'Lord, You Could Not Love Me More!': Saint John Paul II and the Shroud of Turin."

The exhibit is a response to the beloved saint's call for greater understanding of and devotion to the shroud — the burial cloth that many believe was used to wrap the body of Christ after his crucifixion.

During a visit to the shroud in 1998 in Turin, Italy, Pope John Paull II said: "The shroud does not hold people's hearts to itself but turns them to him, at whose service the Father's loving providence has put it. Therefore, it is right to foster an awareness of the precious value of this image, which everyone sees and no one at present can explain."

"For every thoughtful person it is a reason for deep reflection, which can even involve one's life," he added. "The shroud is thus a truly unique sign that points to

Jesus, the true word of the Father, and invites us to pattern our lives on the life of the One who gave himself for us." The exhibit will help visitors encounter the mystery of the shroud, its movement in history, the scientific research done to prove its authenticity, and the faithful devotion to all that the shroud reveals about salvation.

The exhibit will also include a replica of the Shroud of Turin on loan from the National Shroud of Turin Exhibit, over 30 gallery panels containing images and text, and a sculpture called "The Sign," which renders a life-size 3D image of the man of the shroud.

Dr. Gilbert Lavoie, a medical expert on the study of the shroud and author of "The Shroud of Jesus: And the Sign John Ingeniously Concealed," collaborated with sculptor Pablo Eduardo to create the sculpture, which is based on Lavoie's research.

Lavoie's current research on the sculpture will also be profiled in the exhibit.

Opening the exhibit during Lent is meant to encourage visitors to more fully participate in the repentance and conversion associated with the penitential season, which John Paul II touched on during his 1998 visit.

"Contemplation of that tortured body helps contemporary man to free himself from the superficiality of the selfishness with which he frequently treats love and sin. Echoing the word of God and centuries of Christian consciousness, the shroud whispers: Believe in God's love, the greatest treasure given to humanity, and flee from sin, the greatest misfortune in history," the saint said.

In a press release, Anthony Picarello, executive director of the shrine, said the exhibit "resonates so deeply" with St. John Paul II's legacy.

"It illustrates how human beings can approach the deepest mysteries fruitfully with faith and reason together, how the human body can express the most radical love, and — especially during Lent — the power of redemptive suffering."

The shrine's director of mission and ministry, Grattan Brown, added: "In his pilgrimages to shrines around the world, St. John Paul II often observed that shrines are places where people can step away from their busy lives to deepen their spiritual connection to God. The Shroud of Turin, which may be the burial cloth of Jesus, connects us with Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, God's most loving gift for humanity. It is a joy for the St. John Paul II National Shrine to offer this exhibit so that our pilgrims may experience God's mercy during Lent."

COMMUNITY DIRECTOR TEXT FROM BOB WILSON

ne of our Council's ongoing service projects has been feeding the homeless at The Christian Service Center's West Central Blvd. campus. While our Council's involvement dates back over twenty years, the St. James Cathedral parish has been involved with the Center for over fifty years.

In 1971, St. James and four other downtown churches pooled their resources to better serve the hungry, homeless and hurting in our community by forming the Christian Service Center for Central Florida. Since that time, the parishioners of St. James have actively supported the Center's programs.

One of the cornerstones of its programs, Daily Bread, began as the "Peace Meal" served from the patio of the St. James Rectory where the Parish Center now stands. As originally reported in the Orlando Sentinel Star and recalled in the Summer 1999 issue of Jubilee, a parishioner brought a hamper of food to a noonday Lenten "rap session" at the

church. "The following Thursday she did it again, the idea caught on, and really hungry people began coming," the Sentinel Star reported.

The Lenten program was expanded, and 100 to 125 people a day were served from the rectory. Father David Page, pastor at the time, approached the Christian Service Center and in July 1975, the Center assumed responsibility for the program, renaming it Daily Bread. On the occasion of the Center's 40th anniversary in 2011, then-executive director Robert Stuart remarked, "I'm sure the people of St. James when they started feeding the hungry all those years ago had no idea that their ministry would grow into a program that has served over 3.3 million meals today." The number of meals served to the hungry and homeless in our community today through Daily Bread has now grown to over five million.

Former Rector of the Cathedral Father Sean Heslin served as President of the Center in the late 1990's, and under his leadership Daily Bread served its 2 millionth meal, its hotel ministry celebrated 25 years of leading worship at Walt Disney World, and the downtown Alzheimer's Respite Care program expanded into a new facility.

Over the years, several of the Center's programs have "spun off" into their own organizations. Meals On


Wheels (now Seniors First) and Alzheimer's Respite Care (now Share the Care) are among those that began under the Christian Service Center umbrella. In addition, the Center's campus has served as the initial home for other non-profit agencies, such as the local Habitat for Humanity.

Under its current Executive Director, Eric Gray, the Center is evolving into a Comprehensive Day Services Center, co-locating a number of necessary service agencies on its campus. Under this model, the Center is able to focus on those programs that it does best and act as host to local agencies that provide other specialized services.

The Christian Service Center continues to operate: Family & Emergency Services - helping families and individuals who are faced with an unexpected crisis by providing financial assistance, food, clothing and other services from facilities in Orlando and West Orange; Daily Bread – serving nourishing free meals to anyone who is hungry from kitchens in Orlando and West Orange; Unique Boutique – dignified clothing program; and Emergency Food Pantries.

Independent agencies operating at the Center's downtown campus include: S.A.L.T. Outreach -providing showers and laundry, haircuts, clothing and case management; Hope Team – a housing outreach of Orange Blossom Family Health (OBFHC); OBFHC – providing primary and urgent care, behavioral health and labs twice a week from a mobile unit at the Center; Compassion Corner – a ministry of First Presbyterian Church providing counseling services and morning daily devotions; First Step Staffing – assisting the unsheltered with immediate job placement; and Straight Street Ministries – serving lunch and dinner and conducting prayer services and bible studies daily. Since July 2024, Straight Street assumed responsibility from Daily Bread for the daily lunch that Council 12402 serves on the first Monday of each month.

Please join your fellow Knights on the first Monday of each month to serve lunch to the homeless at the Christian Service Center. For more information about the Christian Service Center's programs, visit <u>www.christianservicecenter.org</u>.

FROM THE LIFE DIRECTOR

he 40 Days for Life continues until April 13th in 660 cities around the world. There are 3 prayer vigils in the local area. Visit the Florida 40 Days for Life website for locations and schedules.
Florida is on pace to reduce abortions by 50% in 2025.

A report published by the Journal of American Medicine indicates that in the 18 months after the Dobbs decision, 22,180 additional births occurred in the 14 states where strong pro life laws have been enacted.

The Central Florida Laps for Life 2025 campaign has collected (as of March 21st) \$93,380 which is 75% of their \$125,000 goal. Our council raised \$4350.

In March, the National Right to Life Communication Committee produced a 52 page report on the history and status of abortion in the US.

Here are some of the highlights.

Prior to the Supreme Court's ruling in "Dobbs v Jackson" more than half of the population of the US had always known abortion to be legal. Claims are that 25 to 33% of American women have had at least one abortion.

Surveys by the Society of Family Planning and the Guttmacher Institute show an 11% increase in abortions in 2023 over 2020 primarily from women traveling to other states and or ordering abortion pills online. Pro life groups say these numbers are inaccurate and inflated. The Journal of American Medical Assoc. and the Journal of Public Economics surveys in 2024 show an increase in births in states where abortion restrictions are in place. Due to many variables, an accurate count of abortions in the US is difficult to obtain.

Since "Dobbs" and because of the relaxing of laws governing the sale and distribution of abortion pills, the use of these has skyrocketed and now accounts for nearly two-thirds of all abortions. The danger of the pills have been downplayed by the abortion industry but even the FDA has admitted that 36 deaths and thousands of women with complications requiring ER visits have been attributed to its use.



The Laps for Life fund raiser has brought in \$94.5K. Our team brought in \$4670 which placed St James Knights in 5th place. Les Castro raised \$2370 and PGK George & amp; Joanne Olson raised \$2300. Well done team!

□ Has the member made significant contributions to the Church, community and/or council?


□ Does the member have a robust prayer-life that goes beyond weekly Mass attendance?

Nomination Sources

• Nominations can be made from any council member for 'Knight of the Month'.

• Sources of member nominations can come from parish priests, council members, ministry leaders with active Knights serving their ministry, etc. These sources can also be used to get additional background information on their church, community, or ministry activities.

Provide justification for your nomination when submitting.

Family of the Month Factors to consider in their search for a 'Family of the Month':

□ Has the family made significant contributions to the Church, community and/or council?

□ Is the family tight knit?

□ Does the family spend quality time together?

□ Does the family attend weekly Mass together?

□ Does the family pray together outside of Mass?

□ Does the family serve as a model of Catholic family values?

□ The "Family of the Month" nominated family doesn't need to be a "super family". The nominated family should be a family that lives traditional Christian family values and deserves recognition for doing so. □ It is not required that the catholic gentlemen be a Knight to be eligible for the Family of the Month.

Nomination Sources

• Nominations can be made from any council member who knows of council member families or parish families that support family life.

• Sources of nominations can come from parish priests, neighbors, council members, ministry leaders, etc. They can be used to get recommendations, references and evaluations concerning council families. They can also speak directly to the families being considered.





Knights of Columbus: A Legacy of Charity and Faith

The Knights of Columbus were founded in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney with a mission of charity. The Order quickly expanded beyond the United States, and during World War I, they established welcoming huts offering free services to all. In the 1920s, the Knights advocated for anti-defamation and religious freedom. They renewed their commitment to volunteer service during the Great Depression and later focused on combating communism and fascism post-World War II. In the 1950s, they played a key role in adding "under God" to the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance. The Knights continued to support ecclesial reform and strengthen ties with the Vatican, especially during John Paul II's pontificate.

Into the new millennium, they maintained their charitable work, aiding displaced Christians in the 2010s. The beatification of Father McGivney in 2020 marked a new chapter, with the Order launching initiatives to deepen faith and fraternity. The Knights' history is a testament to their enduring dedication to charity and service.

God, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. 


