



# COMMUNITY DIRECTOR TEXT FROM BOB WILSON

ne of our Council's ongoing service projects has been feeding the homeless at The Christian Service Center's West Central Blvd. campus. While our Council's involvement dates back over twenty years, the St. James Cathedral parish has been involved with the Center for over fifty years.

In 1971, St. James and four other downtown churches pooled their resources to better serve the hungry, homeless and hurting in our community by forming the Christian Service Center for Central Florida. Since that time, the parishioners of St. James have actively supported the Center's programs.

One of the cornerstones of its programs, Daily Bread, began as the "Peace Meal" served from the patio of the St. James Rectory where the Parish Center now stands. As originally reported in the Orlando Sentinel Star and recalled in the Summer 1999 issue of Jubilee, a parishioner brought a hamper of food to a noonday Lenten "rap session" at the

church. "The following Thursday she did it again, the idea caught on, and really hungry people began coming," the Sentinel Star reported.

The Lenten program was expanded, and 100 to 125 people a day were served from the rectory. Father David Page, pastor at the time, approached the Christian Service Center and in July 1975, the Center assumed responsibility for the program, renaming it Daily Bread. On the occasion of the Center's 40th anniversary in 2011, then-executive director Robert Stuart remarked, "I'm sure the people of St. James when they started feeding the hungry all those years ago had no idea that their ministry would grow into a program that has served over 3.3 million meals today." The number of meals served to the hungry and homeless in our community today through Daily Bread has now grown to over five million.

Former Rector of the Cathedral Father Sean Heslin served as President of the Center in the late 1990's, and under his leadership Daily Bread served its 2 millionth meal, its hotel ministry celebrated 25 years of leading worship at Walt Disney World, and the downtown Alzheimer's Respite Care program expanded into a new facility.


Over the years, several of the Center's programs have "spun off" into their own organizations. Meals On Wheels (now Seniors First) and Alzheimer's Respite Care (now Share the Care) are among those that began under the Christian Service Center umbrella. In addition, the Center's campus has served as the initial home for other non-profit agencies, such as the local Habitat for Humanity.

Under its current Executive Director, Eric Gray, the Center is evolving into a Comprehensive Day Services Center, co-locating a number of necessary service agencies on its campus. Under this model, the Center is able to focus on those programs that it does best and act as host to local agencies that provide other specialized services.

The Christian Service Center continues to operate: Family & Emergency Services - helping families and individuals who are faced with an unexpected crisis by providing financial assistance, food, clothing and other services from facilities in Orlando and West Orange; Daily Bread – serving nourishing free meals to anyone who is hungry from kitchens in Orlando and West Orange; Unique Boutique – dignified clothing program; and Emergency Food Pantries.

Independent agencies operating at the Center's downtown campus include: S.A.L.T. Outreach -providing showers and laundry, haircuts, clothing and case management; Hope Team — a housing outreach of Orange Blossom Family Health (OBFHC); OBFHC — providing primary and urgent care, behavioral health and labs twice a week from a mobile unit at the Center; Compassion Corner — a ministry of First Presbyterian Church providing counseling services and morning daily devotions; First Step Staffing — assisting the unsheltered with immediate job placement; and Straight Street Ministries — serving lunch and dinner and conducting prayer services and bible studies daily. Since July 2024, Straight Street assumed responsibility from Daily Bread for the daily lunch that Council 12402 serves on the first Monday of each month.

Please join your fellow Knights on the first Monday of each month to serve lunch to the homeless at the Christian Service Center. For more information about the Christian Service Center's programs, visit www.christianservicecenter.org.



#### FROM THE LIFE DIRECTOR

he 52nd annual March for Life was held in Washington DC on January 24th. The National Catholic Register describes "tens of thousands" marching from the Mall to the Supreme Court. A variety of speakers sounded the pro life message encouraging the crowd to keep fighting for the unborn.

A Pew Research study of 8700 participants in 2024 shows 63% of Americans say abortion should be legal in all cases. The latest KOC-Marist poll shows 67% of Americans support limited restrictions on abortions. 60% support legal abortions up thru the

first three months of pregnancy.

According to the World Health Org., abortion accounts for 42% of deaths worldwide. Over 45 million abortions in 2024 are more than all military and civilian deaths in WWI combined.

Last week, the US Senate failed to reach the needed 60 votes to advance the Born Alive Survivors Protection Act which would have required all medical aid needed to care for a baby of a failed abortion attempt. The House has passed the legislation—twice.

The Central Florida Laps4Life will be held on March 1st at Bishop Moore HS. The fundraising goal this year is \$125,000. To join a team and donate/participate go to Central Florida Laps4Life/Eventpage website.

The JMJ baby bottle campaign reports (as seen in the St. James bulletin) donations of \$4,411 from 180 bottles returned. There are still 290 bottles outstanding.



On a personal note, it was a great pleasure to welcome my son, David, into the Knights of Columbus as a 3rd degree Knight. He is a seminarian applicant for the Dioceses of Orlando and should know about acceptance here in the next few months. Please pray for his vocation.

This great feast occurs during the liturgical season of Christmas, which begins on Christmas Eve and continues through the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. During Christmas time, we all remember and celebrate the reality that God assumed our human nature and became a little child. May this season also remind us to recognize the dignity of all children — including unborn children — today.

Laps for Life offers two ways to support pregnancy centers and maternity homes:

<u>Ultrasound Initiative</u>, whereby the Knights Supreme office in New Haven, Connecticut match 100% of funds raised for purchase of ultrasound machines by qualifying pregnancy centers. As discussed below, so much support has been provided for the Ultrasound Initiative that Laps for Life sometimes looks beyond central Florida to help pregnancy centers obtain this life-saving equipment.

<u>Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP)</u>, whereby the Knights match \$100 for every \$500 raised for non-ultrasound-purchase donations to <u>eligible pregnancy centers or maternity homes</u> – up to \$400 matched (against \$2,000 donated) per center per council per year.

After the March event, Laps for Life will contact each Knights council to ask how they want funds allotted ASAP vs. Ultrasound. Laps for Life will help your councils get your support where it needs to go – within central Florida, or beyond!

### GOOD OF THE ORDER FROM OUR WORTHY LECTURER (LES CASTRO)

Edith Stein OCD (in religion Teresa Benedicta of the Cross; 12 October 1891 – 9 August 1942) was a German Jewish philosopher who converted to Catholicism and became a Discalced Carmelite nun. Edith Stein was murdered in the gas chamber at Birkenau on 9 August 1942, and is canonized as a martyr and saint of the Catholic Church; she is also one of six patron saints of Europe.

Stein was born into an observant Jewish family, but had become an agnostic by her teenage years. Moved by the tragedies of World War I, in 1915, she took lessons to become a nursing assistant and worked in an infectious diseases hospital. After completing her doctoral thesis at the University of Freiburg in 1916, she obtained an assistantship there to Edmund Husserl.

From reading the life of the reformer of the Carmelites, Teresa of Ávila, Stein was drawn to the Christian faith. She was baptized on 1 January 1922 into the Catholic Church. At that point, she wanted to become a Discalced Carmelite nun but was dissuaded by her spiritual mentor, the archabbot of Beuron, Raphael Walzer OSB. She then taught at a Jewish school of education in Speyer. As a result of the requirement of an "Aryan certificate" for civil servants promulgated by the Nazi government in April 1933 as part of its Law for the Restoration of the Professional Civil Service, she had to quit her teaching position. Edith Stein was admitted as a student to the study of religion to the Discalced Carmelite monastery in Cologne on 25 November, on the first vespers of the feast of Saint Teresa of Ávila, and received the religious habit as a novice in April 1934, taking the religious name Teresia Benedicta a Cruce (Teresia in remembrance of Teresa of Ávila, Benedicta in honor of Benedict of Nursia). She made her temporary vows on 21 April 1935, and her perpetual vows on 21 April 1938.

The same year, Teresa Benedicta a Cruce and her biological sister Rosa, by then also a convert and an extern (tertiary of the order, who would handle the community's needs outside the monastery), were sent to the Carmelite monastery in Echt, Netherlands, for their safety. In response to the pastoral letter from the Dutch bishops on 26 July 1942, in which they made the treatment of the Jews by the Nazis a central theme, all baptized Catholics of Jewish origin (according to police reports, 244 people) were arrested by the Gestapo on the following Sunday, 2 August 1942. They were sent to the Auschwitz concentration camp, and were murdered in the Birkenau gas chambers on 9 August 1942.



# Knights of Columbus: A Legacy of Charity and Faith

The Knights of Columbus were founded in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney with a mission of charity. The Order quickly expanded beyond the United States, and during World War I, they established welcoming huts offering free services to all. In the 1920s, the Knights advocated for anti-defamation and religious freedom. They renewed their commitment to volunteer service during the Great Depression and later focused on combating communism and fascism post-World War II. In the 1950s, they played a key role in adding "under God" to the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance. The Knights continued to support ecclesial reform and strengthen ties with the Vatican, especially during John Paul II's pontificate.

Into the new millennium, they maintained their charitable work, aiding displaced Christians in the 2010s. The beatification of Father McGivney in 2020 marked a new chapter, with the Order launching initiatives to deepen faith and fraternity. The Knights' history is a testament to their enduring dedication to charity and service.


