moved by the opportunity to meet so many young Catholics, full of faith and energy. These students are our future, and it was inspiring to witness their devotion and commitment.







FROM OUR INSURANCE REPRESENTATIVE

When Father McGivney founded our Order, a key part of his mission was to help Catholic families attain a secure financial future. In keeping with that mission, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly recently announced updates to our member benefits. Whether or not you are an insured Knight of Columbus, you are entitled to the Member/Spouse Fraternal Benefit. This is an accidental death benefit varies from \$1,500-\$5,000, depending on your age, whether you are insured and how long you've been a member.

The other updates I'd like to call out apply to insured members.

Family Fraternal Benefit: It's guaranteed-issue insurance up to \$10,000 to any child under age 18, regardless of physical or intellectual disabilities. This also includes an automatic \$5,000 death benefit for children who die before age 61 days, including stillbirths from at least 20 weeks after conception.

Orphan Fraternal Benefit: provides \$500 monthly to a member's child who has lost both parents, up to age 19. This benefit also includes up to \$5,000 per year in college scholarships, with a maximum total of \$20,000, per eligible orphan. Widow Benefit: offers surviving spouses of insured Knights the opportunity to purchase Knights of Columbus products, and she and her children are eligible for scholarships. We strive to bring Father McGivney's mission to life by offering you these valuable benefits. I would like to sit down with you to walk you through the benefits available to your family. Thank you, and I pray that Blessed Michael McGivney watches over our families this month.

THE POPE AND THE PRESIDENT

A new exhibit sponsored by the Knights commemorates the relationship between St. John Paul II and President Ronald Reagan

When Pope John Paul II and President Ronald Reagan met in private for the first time in 1982, the encounter went far beyond formalities and official business. The two men shared their spiritual views. They discussed the assassination attempts that had nearly ended both their lives the year before. They prayed.

During that meeting, "they forged a lasting spiritual bond and a close friendship," recalled Past Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. "Years later, Mrs. Reagan would say that the pope was her husband's 'closest friend."

FROM THE LIFE DIRECTOR



ctober is Respect Life Month and the fall 40 Days for Life campaign runs from September 25 to November 3rd. There are a total of 703 cities participating around the world. There are 3 locations in the local area that will hold vigils. The Planned Parenthood clinics in Orlando and Kissimmee and the All Women's Health Center in Altamonte Springs. Information regarding these vigils is available on the 40 Days for Life website.

The Floridians Protecting Freedom group has raised nearly \$48 million towards passing Amendment 4. The latest polls from Florida Atlantic University, Next Gen and Life First has shown a decline in support of the amendment in the range of 54-56% approval with still 19% undecided. 60% is needed for the amendment to pass.10 states will have abortion amendments on their ballots in November.

40,499 abortions were performed in Florida this year up to August 1st even as the rate of increase month to month has slowed since the 6 week ban has been in effect.

Overall, more abortions were reported in the first 3 months of this year compared to the time period before the overturning of Roe v Wade due to telemedicine and availability of the abortion pill.


Assisted suicides continue to climb in the US. California reported nearly 1000 cases in 2023. Numbers are up in New Jersey as groups there are pushing to remove residency requirements. In Oregon efforts are made to "help" patients who have requested but do not qualify for assisted suicide by using VSED-voluntary stop eating and drinking-to qualify with the "terminal illness" of dehydration.

JMJ Pregnancy Center held their annual Gala on September 28th. This is their primary fundraiser for the year.

The baby bottle campaign will be held at St. James Cathedral during the month with donations going to JMJ. This year our KOC council will be partnering with the parish Respect Life Ministry. Details for distributing the bottles is forthcoming.

Nomination Sources

• Nominations can be made from any council member who knows of council member families or parish families that support family life.

• Sources of nominations can come from parish priests, neighbors, council members, ministry leaders, etc. They can be used to get recommendations, references and evaluations concerning council families. They can also speak directly to the families being considered.

Questions for Reflection:





Come and join the patriotic degree of our order! Do you know what the 4th degree is all about? More importantly, do you know what action our Catholic heritage had in our American history?

REACH YOUR HIGHEST POTENTIAL

The Fourth Degree is a group of outstanding Knights, dedicated to promoting patriotism enlightened by their Catholic faith. These Knights, distinguished by exemplary deeds for God, for country, and the Order, are united by the Fourth Degree to support religious, civic, and charitable causes.

Fourth Degree members belong to local units called assemblies. Each assembly is involved in a wide range of public patriotic activities.

Each assembly maintains a Fourth Degree Color Corps and Honor Guard. Uniformed members wearing the Official Uniform, and swords participate in special civic and religious ceremonies. For this reason, the Fourth Degree is often called the visible arm of the Knights of Columbus.

ELIGIBILITY

- To qualify for the Fourth Degree, one must: 1. Be over 18 years of age. 2. Be a citizen of the United States.
- 3. Be a member in good standing with your Council.

4. Be a practical Catholic.

Each candidate receives one banquet ticket, which is included in his fee. No credit is allowed if the candidate does not attend the banquet. Tickets are not transferable.


All fees must be made through the Faithful Comptroller of your assembly.

The official dress for the Fourth Degree Exemplification is a dark suit, long dark necktie, plain white shirt, and black shoes. Religious may wear their clerical garb and members of the armed forces or full-time police, and firefighting officers may wear their respective dress uniforms. Members shall wear official dress plus social baldric, lapel pin and current jewel of office.



Our goal is to build 25 homes, a community center, and install solar-powered streetlights. Your support is vital in providing safe housing, communal spaces, and reliable lighting.





Knights of Columbus: A Legacy of Charity and Faith

The Knights of Columbus were founded in 1882 by Father Michael J. McGivney with a mission of charity. The Order quickly expanded beyond the United States, and during World War I, they established welcoming huts offering free services to all. In the 1920s, the Knights advocated for anti-defamation and religious freedom. They renewed their commitment to volunteer service during the Great Depression and later focused on combating communism and fascism post-World War II. In the 1950s, they played a key role in adding "under God" to the U.S. Pledge of Allegiance. The Knights continued to support ecclesial reform and strengthen ties with the Vatican, especially during John Paul II's pontificate.

Into the new millennium, they maintained their charitable work, aiding displaced Christians in the 2010s. The beatification of Father McGivney in 2020 marked a new chapter, with the Order launching initiatives to deepen faith and fraternity. The Knights' history is a testament to their enduring dedication to charity and service.






