A Message from our Faithful Captain

Who are we?

We chose to be a 4th Degree Sir Knight! We know that the 4th Degree is the Patriot Degree, but maybe not sure of what that all means. We know that one has to be a 3rd Degree first and then go for the 4th, at least that is what we were told. We know that we meet monthly at least some of us. We meet on Substation Rd. Members are from San Pedro, Our Lady of Lourdes, Epiphany, Our Lady of Mt Carmel. Do we really have committees? We have a *Color Corp* but what is this *Knights on Bikes* thing? We have a V4V fundraiser and something about Football winnings and the Veteran Mass.

But the question remains Who are we? Why be a Sir Knight?

Let's slice and dice a little more *Who we are*. First of all, we are Catholic; we go to Mass, we say prayers especially for those in need of a kind word, a prayer. - Mt. Carmel: Thomas McDermitt


Epiphany Cathedral: Brendan McCoy & Jorge Hidalgo (not pictured)



Presently, the AMS has approximately 370 full time priests including 155 active-duty chaplains to provide for the sacramental, spiritual and faith formation care of 1.8 million Catholic service members and their families. As you know, the AMS has all the pastoral challenges of a normal diocese. However, those challenges must be met on a global scale. My job is to help raise awareness of the pastoral mission of our military chaplains and work to ensure that our service members receive the sacramental and spiritual care that they deserve.


