A Message from our Faithful Captain

We are Who We are; but What are We & How are We

In last month's Newsletter, we zeroed in on ***Who we are***.

A group of Catholic men who get together based on our values and beliefs and who made a pledge of: Charity, Fraternalism, Unity, and Patriotism.

In return for making this pledge, we have the distinction of being honored as a Sir Knight.

The Ying: the Honor and the Yang: the give/share.

But **What are we?** Better stated: What do we do to fulfill the **What**; and hence, the honor of being a Sir Knight? I guess it all starts with the pledge we made:

- Charity,
- Fraternalism,
- Unity,
- Patriotism.

Actually, isn't this the beginning and the end of the **What!**

This brings us to the **How**—the Yang part. So how do we judge success? What is the yardstick or measurement? Is it how I am doing or how WE are doing? Let's take it one at a time, **How I am doing?** Isn't this between me and the Almighty; and consequently, the judgement is His alone. So **How are WE doing**—doing as a group of Sir Knights?

Let's look at one of our Pledges; one of the **What's**: PATRIOTISM. **How**, as a group, are we fulfilling our Patriotism Pledge; are we successful in carrying out our pledge?

Seven Functions in all; five of them occurring 1time/yr and one of the five occurring at our monthly meeting.

What is our success? There is a legacy saying called the “80 - 20 Rule”. It means that if you have 100 members in a group, the expected participation is 20. Over the years, this saying has proved to be “Tried and True”.

OK, let's map it out. We have a little over 200 Sir Knights in our Assembly. Using the 80 - 20 Rule, we should expect event participation of 40 Sir Knights (which is the 20 piece of the rule). How many Sir Knights muster for each of the above Patriotism functions? Maybe we should be a little less dramatic. Let's assume that at any one time 100 Sir Knights can't attend or support a function leaving us with 100 Sir Knights available. Using the 100 figure as the baseline then to achieve a 50% rating, we would need 50 Sir Knights in attendance; to achieve a 20% rating, we would need 20 Sir Knights in attendance.

Judgement time and you be the judge. Using the 200 figure as our metric, are we getting 40 Sir Knights attending each function? Using the 100 figure as our metric, are we getting 20 Sir Knights attending each function?

Why not?

Remember we are called Sir Knight. We are called a Sir Knight because we took a pledge as a Knight and as a 4th Degree Knight—the Ying & the Yang: the Honor and the Give/Share.

Can we do better? Should a New Year's Resolution be in the making?

Something for all of us, Sir Knights, to think about.


