Knights of the Third and Fourth Degree are encouraged to attend. Please wear your Assembly or Council Shirt.


### JUNE 19<sup>TH</sup> Special Monthly Meeting – Charitable Donations 2025

Guest Speaker Monsignor Robert Cannon, representing the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA was unable to attend in person this year. Thanks to the technical expertise of SK Mark Crews, Msgr. Cannon joined us via Zoom and, once again, gave an outstanding presentation. Msgr. Cannon spoke about the impact of moral injury calling it "the real deal" and stressing that this trauma was not limited to soldiers. He told the audience that, as Catholics, we had the advantage because we could experience the forgiveness, mercy and love of God through the sacrament of reconciliation. He concluded by encouraging us to be attentive to family and friends, be willing to listen to them and

to walk with them through this difficult journey.




