



Video Message of His Holiness Pope Leo XIV for the 143rd Supreme Convention of the Knights of Columbus August 5, 2025

Dear friends,

I am pleased to greet all of you gathered in Washington, D.C., for the 143rd Supreme Convention of the Knights of Columbus. I also greet those who are participating virtually in these opening ceremonies.


You are meeting during the Jubilee Year of Hope, which encourages the Universal Church, and indeed the entire world, to reflect on this essential virtue, which Pope Francis described as "the desire and expectation of good things to come, despite our not knowing what the future may bring" (*Spes Non Confundit*, 1). I'd like to reflect briefly with you on this important virtue.

As Catholics, we know that the source of our hope is Jesus Christ and he has sent his followers in every age to bring the good news of his saving Paschal Mystery to the entire world. The Church has always been called to be a sign of hope through the proclamation of the Gospel in words as well as in actions. In a particular way during this Holy Year, we are called to be tangible signs of hope for those of our brothers and sisters who experience hardships of any kind.

Your founder, Blessed Michael McGivney, understood this well. He saw the many needs of immigrant Catholics and sought to bring relief to the poor and suffering through his faithful celebration of the sacraments as well as through fraternal assistance, fraternal assistance which continues on to this day.

The Knights of Columbus Florida State Council has unveiled the new Florida State Council pin for the 2025-2027 fraternal years, a symbol of our shared faith and commitment. This beautiful pin is not merely an emblem; it is a profound message and a call to action.

Encircling the pin are the powerful words, "Open Wide The Doors For Christ." These words, first spoken by Saint John Paul II at the beginning of his pontificate, resonate deeply with our mission as Knights of Columbus. The Signal Table: A Sacred Anchor of Faith and Tradition at Assembly 1818



The Signal Table tradition within the Fourth Degree of the Knights of Columbus traces its roots to the early ceremonial practices that emphasized visual symbolism as a means of reinforcing Catholic values and patriotic duty. While the table itself may not appear in the earliest foundational documents of the Order, its emergence reflects the evolution of ritual within the Assembly—particularly during the Ceremony for Renewal of Obligations, where the Signal Table plays a central role.

Historically, the table was introduced to visually anchor the emblems of the Fourth Degree: the Flag, Sword, and Cross. These items were solemnly placed upon the table during ceremonial proceedings to represent the Knight's dual allegiance to Church and Country. Over time, the addition of the Papal Cushion and Bible further enriched the table's theological depth, linking the Knights' civic responsibilities with their spiritual mission.

The use of colored cloths—Royal Blue, Black, or Maroon—was formalized to reflect dignity and uniformity across Assemblies. These colors not only complement the emblems but also evoke the solemnity of the Fourth Degree's purpose: to embody the virtues of patriotism, faith, and fidelity.

In ceremonies dating back decades, the Signal Table has served as a focal point for renewal, reflection, and unity. It is where Knights recommit to their obligations, standing before the sacred symbols that echoes the shape of a cross or anchor emblems of hope, sacrifice, and steadfastness.

Arranged with purpose and care, The Signal Table transforms the hall into a sacred space. Positioned front and center, it draws the eyes of all in attendance.

Each item finds its right place. The Bible resting atop the Papal Cushion speaks of loyalty to both Church and Word. The Cross commands our allegiance to Christ. The sword speaks of readiness to defend truth The flag reminds us of honor and service to our country.

Assembly 1818 continues to uphold the Signal Table not only as a historical practice, but as a visual affirmation of our Fourth-Degree values of patriotism, courage, unity, and faith. The Signal Table is a solemn reminder of our mission, deeply rooted in the legacy of Catholic brotherhood.


