Roses for Life:

The council ordered 500 rose appliques to be sold at all Masses the weekend of Jan. 16th & 17th for a donation. The proceeds would be given to the Kimberly Home in Clearwater. This facility is a multi-building center. It gives housing for young women and their children, educates them on how to parent, has an ultrasound machine, helps the girls in job training, referrals and job placement and provides child care for the children up to the age of 3.

Through the generosity of the parish, the council collected \$1200 for the facility. I presented a very gracious and thankful Executive Director Kate Kelly with the check.

A few brothers expressed the desire to visit Kimberly Home last year, but the pandemic struck and plans were postponed. I mentioned this to her and she was very open to the idea of a visit from us.

Again, my heart-filled thanks go out to <u>Brothers Roger</u> <u>Kenneally, Tom Marrah, Guy Critelli, and Keith Smith</u> for the unselfish giving of their time and energy to help out those in need.


