I have submitted all the dates to Donna in the Parish Office for our meetings and pancake breakfasts, in order to secure the facilities for when we can again start up our activities.



My Dear Brother Knights,


Here is something from the Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge, also an update on my surgery.
